I am assistant professor on tenure track at the Center for Basque Studies of the University of Nevada, Reno, USA, in social anthropology and studio art. I have served one term as vice-president of the EUI AA executive committee. I wish to present my candidacy for a second term in order to ensure, together with my fellow committee members, a smooth continuation of the projects that we launched together, namely the establishment of international chapters, and most specifically in my case, the North American one, consolidating the EUI alumni directory, and ensuring more access of services to the EUI for alumni members, including access to the EUI premises, use of library, and online access to the EUI's academic journal network and database as is usual for EUI researchers.

I was a PhD researcher in the EUI's Social and Political Science department from 1998 to 2002, under the supervision of Michael Keating, on the subject of cross-frontier cooperation, identity and European integration, with a focus on the Basque Country. I then stayed on two years as research assistant in the Robert Schuman Center for Advanced Studies, and two years as research partner for a EU-funded project on Linguistic Minorities in European Borders.
