1. Formalities

- Eligibility
- Deadlines
- Time management
- Host institution



2. Idea, Topic

- Idea is important
- Based on findings and experiences but also "new"
- Brainstorming, own opinion, but also community check



3. My two attempts

- My interest in ERC started as MWF in 2008/2009
- In 2010 rejected, in 2011 succeeded
- 2010:
 - Dissertation as Springer-book
 - 3 book chapters
 - 6 peer-reviewed articles (mostly as 2nd author)
 - 2 submissions
 - H-index=3
 - 17 citations
 - "low and weak"
- 2011:
 - Two more mono-authored papers
 - 27 citations
 - H-index=5
- Proposal hardly changed



4. Resources for writing

- One month full-time for proposal
- Three kinds of help:
 - 10 seniors
 - 5 colleagues with ERC grant
 - Agencies, seminars, workshops
- No compromises: idea and presentation must be excellent
- Endless time, unconditional priority



5. Proposal

- Extended synopsis (B1) is important
- List aims, list and repeat innovative and convincing points
- State of the Art (SOTA)
- Explain how you want to answer your question (logic! design!)
- Summarize each part at the end
- A graph on each page
- Strategic use of host, network and "advisors"
- Write for an multi-disciplinary audience
