## "Enhancing the Efficiency of European Research Funding in the Social Sciences (in Times of Financial Restraint)"

One of the key objectives of the Europe 2020 Strategy is to enhance the quality and international attractiveness of Europe's higher education system by promoting student and young professional mobility. Among others, this process implies adequate and efficient research funding across the European Research Area. Since its founding, the Academic Careers Observatory (ACO) of the Max Weber Post-Doctoral Programme (MWP) of the European University Institute (EUI) has been monitoring the development of national academic systems, and the different types of funding provided by the EU and its Member states. The target of the ACO is junior scholars in the area of Social Sciences and Humanities (SSH).

The 5<sup>th</sup> MWP-ACO conference will gather together academics, policy-makers and representatives of European and national funding agencies to discuss how to enhance the efficiency of different national and supra-national research funding schemes. The discussion on what constitutes best practice and on the most glaring problems will be enriched by the presentation of the "Preliminary Results of the Survey on Research Funding in the Social Sciences and Humanities in Europe", jointly organized with the European Economic Association (EEA) and the European Sociological Association (ESA). In the afternoon, the conference will focus on funding possibilities for young researchers during times of financial restraint and will involve direct consultations with the speakers and moderators.
