## AREAS OF SPECIALIZATION

Comparative politics with an emphasis on legislatures, political parties, and party systems of the European Union and individual countries of East Central and Western Europe.

International Politics with an emphasis on international political economy, international organizations, and foreign policy analysis.

## SELECTION OF COURSES TAUGHT

---

**Introduction to World Politics (Lower Division Undergraduate).** This course is designed to introduce students to the study of comparative and international politics by examining how the fundamental struggles that take place over the boundaries between politics and economics, and between state and society have played out in several different countries around the world.

**Introduction to International Relations (Lower Division Undergraduate).** A basic introduction to the major theories of international relations to understand and explain the central issues and concepts in the field.

**The Politics and Institutions of the European Union (Upper Division Undergraduate).** An in depth introduction to the politics and institutions of the European Union including the major theories of integration and current events and issues.

**European Government and Politics (Upper Division Undergraduate).** The purpose of this course is to familiarize students with the politics of Western Europe, not on a country by country basis, but in a truly comparative way. The overarching theme of the course is that political institutions or "the rules of the game" governing politics exert a powerful influence on political outcomes, both domestically and at the European level.
