Research News

The new [Global Governance Programme](#) means to contribute to the understanding of global governance issues, to contribute to academic and policy debates, to train new generations of scholars, public officials and practitioners, and to encourage interaction between academics, policy makers, journalists and activists. The programme starts its activities in the academic year 2009/10 and is directed by Miguel Maduro.

Giovanni Federico was awarded an Advanced Investigators Grant from the European Research Council for his project [Market Integration and the Welfare of Europeans](#). The project is hosted at the RSCAS and aims at mapping the long-run process of integration of the European and world markets, from the early modern period to present, and at assessing its effects on the welfare and on institutions.

The European Development Report 2009

The European Report on Development| 2009 (ERD2009), *Overcoming Fragility in Africa - Forging a New European Approach* will be presented in Stockholm on 22 October during the European Development Days. It is the main outcome of the Mobilizing European Research for Development Policies initiative. The aim of this initiative, which includes an Annual Report and a series of conferences and events, is to help the European Union to refine its vision and enrich its policies on development.

Major Events

A conference on *Courts and Democracy*, dedicated to the memory of Federico Mancini, took place on 15 and 16 September with many distinguished participants among whom Stepher Breyer, Associate Justice of the US Supreme Court and Allan Rosas, Judge of the Court of Justice of the European Communities.

As part of the RSCAS Migration Programme, the Final Report on [Labour Markets Performance and Migration Flows in Arab Mediterranean Countries](#) was presented at a [conference in Cairo](#) on 11 and 12 October 2009. The conference was hosted by Cairo University and opened by the Egyptian Minister for Employment, H.E Eisha Abdel Hady, and it gathered scholars and policy makers from both shores of the Mediterranean. The conference was co-financed by the European Commission, DG Economic and Financial Affairs and DG Employment.

The [Florence School of Regulation](#) hosted a high-level workshop on *Preparing the European Industrial Initiative on Electricity Grids*, organized by the European Commission DG Research, on 14 October.

The fifth session of the [Annual FSR Training Course](#) starts with a residential week in Florence from 26 - 30 October.

[CARIM](#) organises a Thematic Session on *Highly-Skilled Migration into, through and from Southern and Eastern Mediterranean and Sub-Saharan Africa* in Florence on 30 November and 1 December 2009.

The *launch conference of the European Union Democracy Observatory (EUDO)* takes place on 3 and 4 December.

October 2010. The general topic will be *Up to and beyond 2015: Adapting Development to New Challenges*, to be further specified in Autumn 2009.

The project *Private Transnational Regulation: Constitutional Foundations and Governance Design* addresses key questions concerning the mix of public and private power in transnational governance which are raised by the emergence of transnational private regulatory regimes. The project is coordinated by Fabrizio Cafaggi at the RSCAS and also includes researchers at Tilburg University and University College Dublin. It is funded by the Hague Institute for the Internationalisation of Law (HiIL).

The *Florence School of Regulation* starts its activities in a new area, that of *Communications and Media*, with the organization of two events in October and November 2009. The Communication and Media Area has been created by the FSR in partnership with the European Regulators Group for electronic communications networks and services and will be financed by the contributions of telecom companies. It is directed by Pier Luigi Parcu. A workshop on *Regulated Access to NGA: presenting and discussing the new Commission recommendation*, takes place on 20 November.

The *PIREDEU Design Study* held its fourth Steering Committee meeting on 9 September 2009 on the occasion of the ECPR General Conference. The meeting evaluated the data collection efforts linked to the European Parliament elections in June 2009. In particular, PIREDEU conducted a mass voter survey and a survey of the candidates to the European Parliament in all 27 EU member states, collected the party manifestos of all major

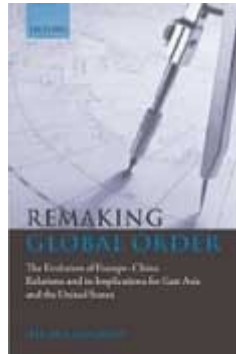
national parties participating in the elections, and carried out a media study in all countries. An initial pre-release of the data collected is envisaged for Spring 2010.

The *Observatory on Citizenship in Europe (EUCITAC)*, co-funded by the European Commission, DG JLS, has launched its website in September 2009: <http://eudo-citizenship.eu/>. The new web-based observatory provides analyses and data on citizenship laws and policies in all EU member states and six neighboring countries.

The RSCAS will continue to host the ERD-Team in 2010. CARIM has recently broadened its research potential to five new countries in Sub-Saharan Africa and expanded its network of correspondents, now covering 17 countries. To allow for a knowledge transfer among old and new experts from Eastern & Southern Mediterranean and Sub-Saharan countries, the project organised a two-day intensive

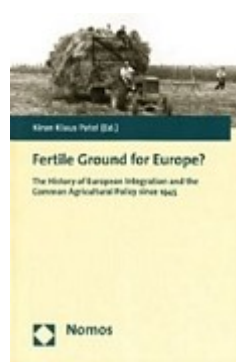
