

EUI-RSCAS Publications (series and books)

Information for Authors

General information

- ▶ The Robert Schuman Centre for Advanced Studies accepts manuscripts for consideration only from its members (faculty, fellows, visitors) or invited scholars.
- ▶ As of 2004, the EUI has adopted and implements an open access publishing policy. Therefore all EUI-RSCAS publications (Working Papers, Policy Papers, books, etc.) are systematically inserted in full text in the EUI's open archive repository (CADMUS), the RSCAS publications database and the EUI Library catalogue. The RSCAS may also decide to have its books published elsewhere (partners websites, EUbookshop...).
- ▶ In submitting a manuscript or allowing one's work to be included in an edited volume, authors formally license the EUI-RSCAS non-exclusive rights to publish and distribute their article by any means, and particularly as an online e-publication (secured .pdf). Authors must sign the 'Agreement to Publish' form provided by the RSCAS Publications Unit. Authors must ensure that any subsequent publication of the work with other publishers complies with the terms of the agreement form, the above-mentioned license and the EUI's open access publication policy. The license is granted royalty free, and the EUI-RSCAS cannot cede it to another publisher.
- ▶ Submissions should be based on original research and are expected to be for first publication. Previously published articles are not accepted for publication in any RSCAS series or as book contributions. Manuscripts submitted in the framework of a specific RSCAS research programme/project (European Forum, Transatlantic Programme, Pierre Werner Chair, etc.) should first be accepted by programme/project director(s).
- ▶ Authors maintain the copyright on their work, should it be published as a paper in a RSCAS series or as a book contribution. However, the EUI also holds a copyright on its ISBNed books. Authors are required to inform the RSCAS and/or, when applicable, get the RSCAS's consent for subsequent publications elsewhere and to include full acknowledgement in those publications.
- ▶ Formal errors and opinions expressed in the paper/contribution are the responsibility of the authors. Authors are also responsible for obtaining written permission to use third part copyrighted materials and for any consequential obligation(s) deriving from further publication of their work with other publisher(s).
- ▶ Links, including deep links, to the EUI-RSCAS online publications database from author(s)' *personal or institutional websites* are permitted. The RSCAS would appreciate information on these links. Maintenance of the accuracy of the link is in the third part responsibility.
- ▶ Reproduction, even partially, of the EUI-RSCAS text on other websites or web pages is *strictly* forbidden.

- ▶ Manuscripts are expected to be finalised in **camera-ready form** in the required file format (usually .doc or .rtf; see Technical Guidelines), and the RSCAS will not edit them. Therefore, when submitting their paper/contribution, authors are strongly encouraged to:
 - Carefully fulfil all editing and proof-reading tasks, with particular attention to the completeness and accuracy of footnotes and references, and to precision in grammar and spelling.
 - Take care of linguistic revision (especially when the author is not writing in his/her native language), and
 - Carefully observe the EUI 'Technical Guidelines for Authors'.

The RSCAS reserves the right to refuse submissions that do not comply with its publication guidelines, or that it finds linguistically unacceptable.

Specific information for publications in a RSCAS series (Working Papers, Policy Papers, etc.)

- ▶ Manuscripts submitted for consideration by the RSCAS should be sent electronically to the working papers assistant, at rsc-wp@iue.it. A printed copy for reference is welcome. NB: Titles should be simple and easily understood.
- ▶ Articles should not be submitted simultaneously to other Working Paper series, or similar equivalents. However, authors may submit their article simultaneously either to peer-reviewed journals or as a chapter in an edited book, provided that, once accepted by the RSCAS, eventual acceptance from other publishers does not prevent the EUI-RSCAS prior/simultaneous publication. The RSCAS encourages further publications and is available to help resolve any conflicts that may arise with other publishers.
- ▶ Recommended and preferred language is UK English. French, German and Spanish texts can also be submitted for consideration, though authors should be aware that this might delay the review process and limit readership.
- ▶ Manuscripts are confidentially peer-reviewed. They may be rejected or accepted, or publication may be conditional on revision as indicated by the reviewer. Authors should send revised manuscripts within one month of the request.
- ▶ Unless expressly agreed otherwise, affiliation, e-mail and web addresses will be mentioned in the paper to allow readers to contact author(s) directly.
- ▶ Ten printed copies will be supplied free of charge to the author(s), who can also order extra copies in advance, at cost in force.
- ▶ ISSN number of the EUI-RSCAS Working Papers series is 1028-3625.

Specific information for publication in RSCAS books

- ▶ Camera-ready manuscripts, as well as any original files embedded in the text, should be sent electronically to the editor or other specified contact person. A printed copy for reference is welcome. NB: Titles should be as short as possible, simple and easily understood.
- ▶ Editor(s) and the RSCAS Director have the final decision on all aspects of individual contributions, including modifications and corrections. Authors are reminded to carefully follow any publication/editorial instructions provided to them, and to submit only complete and final versions.
- ▶ The RSCAS takes care of the final standard book layout.
- ▶ Proofs are sent to the editor(s), for review, but not to individual contributors.
- ▶ Books are ISBNed and the EUI holds the copyright to these books. Therefore further reproductions or eventual simultaneous submission to another publisher requires the consent of the EUI-RSCAS.
- ▶ Three printed copies will be supplied free of charge to the editor(s) and one to each contributor. Editors and contributors may order extra copies, at cost in force, so long as the book remains in stock. Off-prints are not available.
