The Migration Policy Centre (MPC) conducts advanced policy-oriented research on global migration, asylum and mobility to serve governance needs at European and global levels, from developing, implementing and monitoring migration-related policies to assessing their impact on the wider economy and society.

RESEARCH

• **Observatories** are at the heart of the Centre's identity: CARIM-South (Migration in the Southern and Eastern Mediterranean), CARIM-East (Migration in the post-Soviet space), CARIM-India (India to EU Migration) and GLMM (Migration in Gulf Cooperation Council States).

Standardisation is a built-in property of the regional observatories, which lend themselves to space and time comparison and ultimately to the construction of a unique observation system spanning all relevant countries.

• Core programmes:

- Migration in Europe in a period of economic crisis Europe faces two challenges: overcoming a deep economic crisis and addressing an unprecedented form of demographic decline. Policymakers must respond at once to short-term concerns that see migration as part of the problem, and to long-term concerns that see it as part of the solution.

- Migration in the Arab world in a period of dramatic political developments

Together with specific studies of the Syrian refugees crisis, its impact on the first countries of asylum at the border of Syria and the response of Europe, several studies are dedicated to rising flows of people smuggled through the Mediterranean.



- Specialised and executive trainings are organised in Italy and abroad within the framework of MPC projects.



Objective of CONTENTION: inform, analyse and compare the EU Return Directive based judicial control of pre-removal detention of third-country nationals in EU Member States with a view to improving it, in particular regarding control over detention length.
