| Job description:                          | The EUI is launching a two-year project on "The transformation<br>of global governance". Its aim is to explore the way the<br>economic and financial regime based on global rules and<br>principles and supported by a network of specialised<br>international institutions is currently being reshaped.<br>Strengthened economic nationalism, rising regionalism, the<br>shifting role of countries such as the US and China, as well as<br>technological advances, are all forces which question the<br>traditional reliance on a system of universal, public, treaty-<br>based, institution-supported and legally enforceable rules that<br>have formed the basis of global governance.<br>Against this background, the project will examine the new<br>governance formats which are emerging and are not<br>underpinned by a legal order nor supported by powerful<br>institutions, but rather work through peer, opinion or market<br>pressure, as well as through commitment of infra-national |

|                 | players such as sub-national governments and cities. A priority<br>for research and public policy is to understand how these<br>arrangements work, what they have achieved and whether they<br>could form the basis of an emerging new governance model. The<br>aim of the project is to explore these issues by drawing from<br>sectoral experiences in areas as diverse as international trade<br>and investment, climate change, taxation, banking regulation,<br>global financial safety nets, migration, internet regulation and<br>cybersecurity.<br>In this context, the EUI is issuing a call for a research fellow or a<br>research assistant to participate in the preparation, research and<br>management of the project.
