The <u>WellSIRe project</u> aspires to produce a comprehensive and robust empirical analysis of the social investment paradigm on its own terms. Using the analytical grid of 'stock', 'flow' and 'buffer' policies in institutional complementarity, it puts the social investment perspective, as a distinct welfare paradigm, to the test of macroand micro-level wellbeing returns in post-industrial European welfare states.

Job description

The research fellow will carry out research work in an independent manner and collaborate on the research work of the project. The research assistant will provide research assistance to the Project Director(s).

Main tasks include:

 Carrying out a micro-level analysis of subjective wellbeing in relation to welfare policies and provision across EU countries, based on Eurofound living-and-working condition data, ESS, and national-level longitudinal panel data.
