Project details

The Post-Authoritarian Norms and the Ideological Legacy of Dictatorships (POSTNORM) project will start in September 2023 and last five years.

The research team aims to unpack the ways in which past authoritarian regimes affect the hearts and minds of citizens and political elites, upon democratic transition. The idea here is to examine how the ideological associations with the old (authoritarian) regime serve as a focal point for norms about what are appropriate political positions for voters and parties, and what are not. We will search into ways to shed light on this process by disentangling private from revealed preferences. The project consists of two packages, the first looking at public opinion through survey experiments and the second looking at both semantic and programmatic choices made by political elites. The major challenge in the first package will be to innovate in detecting the role of social pressure and beliefs about appropriateness in the expression of political preferences. The major challenge in the second package is to innovate in the usage of political text as a way of looking at how elites respond to the presence of such political norms.

Job description

The research fellow will carry out research work in an independent manner and collaborate on the research work of the project. The research assistant will provide research assistance to the Project Director(s).

Main tasks include:

- Helping with the conduct of survey experiments;
- Retrieving and analysing parliamentary speeches and other sources using text-as-data methods;
- Assembling data about parties across multiple coutries over time;
- Helping with the statistical analysis and the writing-up of academic papers.
