



Policy for Personal homepages at the EUI

A number of students, professors and staff have personal homepages, below please find the Institutes policy for these pages: their use and content.

Conditions

All students, professors and staff members who wish to have access to create and maintain a personal homepage must respect the following conditions:

General

- All information and links to such information inserted via a Web server at the EUI must uphold Italian and international laws, including copyright laws (e.g., in relation to reproduction of texts and images as well as the use of programmes) and penal laws (e.g., harassment, insult, plagiarism, incitement to break the law, racism, pornography etc.)
- No commercial ventures may be undertaken neither must there be any advertisements for commercial ventures via the EUI's Web servers unless the operation is related directly to the EUI and its activities.
- The EUI reserves the right to prevent access to the Internet whenever it is believed that its usage is damaging for the EUI's reputation and activities, including usage that results in unnecessary overloading of the EUI's network.
- The responsibility for any criminal act or damage caused to the EUI's network through unlawful use of personal home pages lies with the individual concerned.
- Updating and maintenance of the home page will be the task of the owner who will also be liable for its contents and links.
- When access to the Internet is requested and permitted, and thereby the possibility for inserting information, researchers give consensus that they will uphold the conditions laid down for access to the network.

Size

- A homepage plus images usually should not exceed 40MB.

Design

- All personal homepages must as a minimum contain the EUI logo and name, in the left upper corner, functioning as a link to the Institute homepage.
- The EUI name and logo must not be altered or used in part.
- Templates are provided for easy use, but usage is not mandatory.

Termination of personal homepages

- A personal homepage will be closed and all content deleted no later than half a year after a researcher has lost other access rights (email account).

Upholding the conditions

- Usage that infringes the conditions laid down may also lead to temporary or permanent loss of EUI computing rights.
- In the first instance, any infringement of the rules will result in the person concerned being requested to remove the information from the Web server. If the Webmaster finds that the information inserted is of such damaging character that it should immediately be removed without giving notice, then s/he may do this.
