### Brussels introduces electronic voting guide

In Brussels, an electronic voting guide is being introduced for the first time to help voters decide which party suits them best in the upcoming European elections.

Voters can use the EU profiler on a special website [euprofiler.eu](http://euprofiler.eu) It can also be consulted on RNW's own website [radionetherlands.nl](http://radionetherlands.nl) as we are one of the project's media partners.

The compilers of the EU profiler have compared around 300 political parties. It is available in all EU languages and has been adapted for each individual EU country. The web application is a Dutch invention, introduced for the Netherlands' parliamentary election in 2006. A special version was also developed for the US election last November.
