Are you a closet socialist? Do you secretly harbour sympathy for the Party for Animals? Have you thought about voting Green? Such questions flash across the mind of the average voter in the run-up to major elections.

The European Parliamentary elections are in just six weeks time and today sees the launch of a tool that could help you match your opinion with a box to tick on your ballot paper. The EU Profiler asks you a series of questions on everything from taxation to immigration.

According to the EU Profiler website, tool is a means for voters to gain an unobstructed view of the European political landscape, and their place within it. This landscape is defined by

the policies of the parties vying for election to the European Parliament (EP).

The EU Profiler gives users a 'political profile' based on their responses to a questionnaire. The user is invited to offer their reaction to a series of 30 statements with one of five responses, ranging from 'completely agree' to 'completely disagree'. Users can also offer no opinion.

At the same time, the tool holds a record of the positions held by the political parties on the same 30 issues. The user's political profile can then be examined in relation to the political parties of Europe. One of the central *ideas* of the profiler - according to its designers - is to get politicians to be clearer about what they stand for - straight talking in other words.
