Thu 23/04/09 16:10 - With the European elections now just a little over six weeks away many voters are still undecided as to which party to vote for between 4 and June 7 (elections are on Sunday June 7 here in Belgium). The EU Profiler website has the aspiration of making the choice easier for the millions of Europeans who are voting.

Starting from today, 23 April, all people voting in the European Parliament elections have the opportunity to analyse which party is closest to their political preferences.



The European University Institute (EUI) in collaboration with two technological partners, the Dutch company "*Kieskompas*" and the Swiss "*NCCR/Politools*" officially launched the EU PROFILER on Thursday in Brussels.

The EU PROFILER was researched and designed by an international team of social scientists. It combines information on the various party's stances and positions. The profiler presents 300 European parties in various analyses and visualizations that allow voters to see which party is closest to their preferences.

By answering a simple questionnaire, users will obtain a presentation of their policy preferences which allows them to compare their opinions to the positions of all of parties standing for the elections.

The EU Profiler provides multiple options for further analysis of the political position of the user.

The results are displayed in a party match, a two-dimensional graph and in a multidimensional spider web graph.

Reflect, discuss and analyse

The tool enables the user to reflect, discuss and analyse his or her political preferences and to position him- or herself in the

European political landscape.

The EU Profiler is available for all EU Member States and in most of the EU national languages from today, 23 April.
