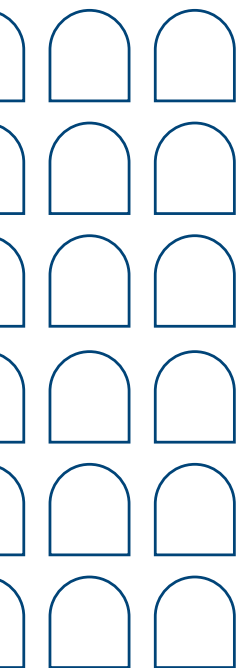

POLICY LEADERS

Each year, the STG welcomes between 20 and 30 Policy Leader Fellows (PLFs) from all over the world with diverse backgrounds and experiences in the field of public policy. All fellowship activities aim to broaden fellows’ horizons beyond their own field of expertise and empower them with skills, models and tools. The fellows are a peer-to-peer learning community embedded in a world-class teaching and research environment.

Fellows are independent, curious and self-motivated doers, who work independently to complete their projects throughout their fellowship. During their time at the STG, the fellows challenge the state of play, develop policy recommendations and practical solutions for pressing issues of transnational relevance. They take part in tailored professional skills development workshops and small-group sessions with leading policymakers and world-class researchers. Fellows lead on the STG talks, provide case studies to the STG master’s programme, contribute to the STG Policy Papers and other publications.



The fellows enrich the STG community by bringing their first hand experiences to teaching, training and networking at the School. Besides having direct access to the EUI and the STG faculty as well as the researchers community, the fellows form lasting professional and personal bonds with each other.

YOUNG AFRICAN LEADERS

The tailor-made Young African Leaders Programme (YALP), funded by the European Commission, aims at catalysing and fostering changes as envisioned in the Africa Agenda 2063 and in the Africa-EU Partnership.

Launched in 2020, the fellowship provides a unique opportunity for young policy experts from Africa to further develop their policy work and leadership skills amidst international experts. The programme targets mid-career, high potential policymakers, diplomats, and professionals from Africa, working in national and local authorities, regional, continental, international organisations, civil society organisations, academia, the media and the private sector in Africa.

The programme aims to create new networks and bring together a strong cohort of leaders who want to drive change in their own countries and across the African continent. Throughout their fellowship, the Young African Leaders take part in workshops, training and skills development activities, conferences and study visits in Europe.

VISITING FELLOWS

The STG welcomes a number of visiting scholars who are pursuing a PhD or are in the post-doctoral phase of their careers and seek to further develop their research agenda. Visiting fellowships are also open to policy practitioners for a short-term project in collaboration with members of the STG community that can benefit from the EUI environment and resources.

SENIOR VISITING FELLOWS

Senior visiting fellows are established leaders in their field, who want to engage with the STG community in shaping the discourse on issues relating to transnational governance. Throughout their time at the School, senior visiting fellows share their expertise in a particular policy area through formal and informal exchanges with the STG and EUI members.

Both visiting and senior visiting fellows are an integral part of the wider STG fellowship community and are expected to interact with STG members during their stay. Visiting and senior visiting fellows have access to the EUI and STG facilities, including the library. They are encouraged to take part in all open events and seminars as well as in the tailored trainings offered to STG Fellows.
