This workshop deals with the effects of family forms and dynamics on children's shortand long-term life chances and well-being. It is divided into two sessions. The first one focuses on parental separation and its implications for children's well-being, educational attainment and, more in general, for the intergenerational reproduction of inequality. The second session discusses the role of parental practices for children's well-being and inequality. In both sessions special interest is paid to research design that enable to identify causal effects of family dynamics on inequalities in children's life chances.
