

EUI Climate Week 2022

2-6 May 2022 | Florence, Italy

The EUI Climate Week consisted of the Florence Process (a closed session on 3 May), the conference 'A New Normal for Carbon Markets?' on 4 May, and the climate related sessions of State of the Union 2022 on 5 May. The meetings were held in a hybrid form on the EUI premises, partly in Palazzo Buontalenti in Florence city centre, and partly in the Badia Fiesolana in Fiesole.

The conference 'A New Normal for Carbon Markets?' was organised together with PIK (Potsdam Institute for Climate Impact Research) and IETA (International Emissions Trading Association). The audience was a mixture of well-informed policy makers coming from academia, private businesses, think-tanks, and carbon market observers.

The event comprised of three sessions discussing respectively, latest developments in compliance markets, how to strengthen the integrity of voluntary markets, and carbon clubs and border measures. The intention was to have a rich exchange of views, in which all participants were offered an opportunity to intervene.

The Florence Process was a closed meeting that brought together representatives of the key jurisdictions with emissions trading programmes from the EU, China, California, Quebec and New Zealand, to address issues of common concern and interest. The event was jointly organised by DG Climate Action, STG Climate and the Florence School of Regulation Climate. Participation was by invitation of the European Commission only.
