PhD students and early career researchers (no more than 5 years from PhD completion) are invited to submit proposals.

We encourage submissions on any aspects of postwar Western European cooperation and integration, broadly conceived. Of particular interest are papers that make use of newly available primary sources and innovative methodologies.

Applicants should submit an abstract of no more than 300 words and a short CV **by 31 March 2018** to agc.history.europe@gmail.com.

Selected applicants will be informed **by mid-April 2018**.
