For safety and security reasons after the conclusion of the guided tour it
will *not* be permitted to remain on the grounds of Villa Salviati.

- Access to Villa Salviati will be only possible *on foot* from the following entrances:
 - **Via Bolognese 156 - Bus n.25** (direction Pratolino), bus stop **“Il Cionfo 01”**
 - **Via Faentina 261 - Bus n.1**, bus stop **“Salviati FS”** – please note that to get from Faentina entrance to the Villa it takes about 10 minutes on foot walking along a mildly steep graveled alley. At the bus stop, a dedicated shuttle service will be available for visitors with limited mobility
 - Disabled visitors who are arriving by car (showing a disability sign) may enter the Villa and park inside. Access by car by Via Salviati 3.
