[Emilio Colombo](#): His private papers have arrived temporarily in Florence for treatment, inventorying and digitisation, following the signature in December 2019 of a cooperation agreement between the HAEU and the Luigi Sturzo Institute, where the papers are deposited for long-term preservation.
