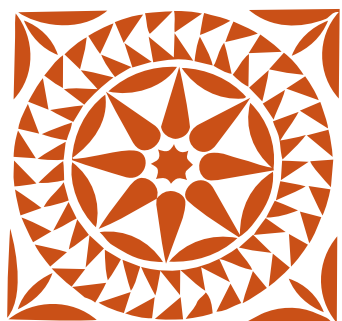
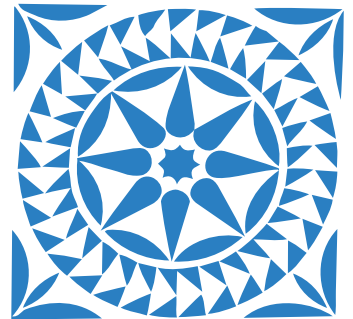

FOREWORD FROM THE EUI PROVOST FOR RESEARCH AND EXTERNAL RELATIONS

Welcome to the 18th edition of the EUI Directory of Academic Publications and Data, a snapshot of the curiosity, craft, and collective energy behind research at the European University Institute. With the world changing fast, we've been thinking hard about what good social science and humanities research looks like today and how to make it matter. At the time of writing, the EUI is at a symbolic moment: nearing our 50th anniversary, and a year into the life of the new Cadmus, our research repository. It is also a moment to pause and take stock of what we are building together, and of the responsibility that comes with it.

At the heart of the EUI is a community of scholars, early-stage researchers, postdoctoral fellows, and faculty from around the world, who ask ambitious and challenging questions and follow the evidence wherever it leads. They work on many of today's most challenging issues, often across disciplines and methods, while keeping research independent, rigorous, and open to debate. Much of this work also travels beyond the seminar room: into policy conversations, public discussion, datasets, and new research tools, often through partnerships with European and national institutions.

A major engine of this research life is our doctoral and postdoctoral programmes, including the Max Weber and Jean Monnet Programmes, which give talented researchers time, mentoring, and an intense intellectual environment to develop bold work. Supported by committed faculty and professional staff, the EUI research community is deeply connected to international scholarly networks, publishing in leading outlets and engaging in debates that shape how we understand Europe and the world.

This year's directory captures that momentum. With 1,428 publications, EUI scholars produced 77 books, 249 book chapters, 161 theses, 623 journal articles, 115 working papers, and 175 research reports, lectures, policy briefs, and papers, alongside 22 new datasets and 6 videos. These outputs reflect a research culture that values substance, originality, and reach, from foundational scholarship to work that informs real-world choices.

We are also strengthening our commitment to Open Access, so that EUI research can be read, used, and built on as widely as possible. I encourage you to explore Cadmus, the EUI Research Repository (<https://cadmus.eui.eu>), which is updated daily and increasingly features our work freely accessible in Open Access format. Broadening access helps research travel further, into classrooms, policy arenas, civil society, and new research projects.

It's a pleasure to present this 18th edition of the Directory. My deepest congratulations go to all our scholars, and my thanks to the colleagues whose work makes this directory and Cadmus possible. I hope you'll use this report as a resource and as a reminder of what this community produces when it has the space to think, test, and publish. And I hope it also conveys something less visible but equally real: the care, generosity, and quiet persistence that sustain serious research day after day.

INTRODUCTION FROM THE EUI LIBRARY DIRECTOR

I am pleased to present the 18th edition of the EUI Academic Publications and Data Directory, showcasing the research contributions of EUI members published in 2025, an edition that coincides with the 50th anniversary of the European University Institute.

The Directory is structured by publication type and includes books, theses, journal articles, book chapters, working papers, research reports, and datasets, offering a comprehensive overview of the EUI's scholarly output.

In 2025, the EUI academic community produced 1,428 research outputs, of which 1,139 are available in full text (80%), and of these 947 (83%) are already Open Access. Overall, 66% of this year's research outputs are Open Access, reinforcing the EUI's commitment to the wide dissemination of knowledge. I am particularly pleased to note that, for the fifth consecutive year, Open Access publications have outnumbered non-OA content.

The EUI Library plays a key role in this effort by assisting EUI authors in understanding which versions of their publications can be made openly available. To ensure that this support delivers the best possible results for the scholarly community, the Library relies on a dedicated Open Science support team which, although small in size, is highly specialised and provides expert guidance across publishing, data, and research visibility.

To present a complete picture of the scientific output produced at our institution, I strongly encourage all EUI members to provide the full text of their research. Doing so further increases the visibility and accessibility of our discoveries and academic advances.

At the moment of launching this publication, we celebrate the first anniversary of a crucial technological transition - new Cadmus repository - designed to meet the quality standards required by the EUI community.

EUI members are required to deposit their publications in Cadmus, ensuring their visibility and retrievability. Thanks to the [Library's ORCID–Cadmus integration](#) implemented by the Library, publications listed in Cadmus are automatically pushed to the ORCID profiles of EUI members, simplifying research dissemination and enhancing visibility.

The Library's support for Open Access is also materialised through transformative and special agreements with scholarly publishers. Since 2020, more than 300 articles have been published Open Access without authors having to pay APCs, thanks to agreements covering over 9,000 journal titles. In addition, the Fair Open Science Fund supports non-profit Open Access initiatives, reflecting the EUI's commitment to equitable and sustainable research dissemination.

Finally, I would like to express my sincere thanks to all EUI researchers who have diligently deposited their publications in Cadmus, embracing Open Access whenever possible. Your contributions help increase the global visibility of EUI research and ensure that knowledge remains open and accessible to all.

Cadmus, the EUI's research repository, has been dedicated for over **20 years** to collecting, preserving, and providing access to the EUI's research outputs in alignment with the EUI Open Access policy. Serving as the primary showcase for EUI's Research Output, Cadmus now hosts nearly **33,000 records**. Managed as a core service of the EUI Library, Cadmus ensures global dissemination of EUI's publications, data, and videos, with **48% of its content available in open access**. Its metadata is in the **public domain**, supporting reuse and interoperability through open international protocols.

The new Cadmus was successfully launched on 5 May 2025, migrated to DSpace 7 technology. This represented a key milestone in 2025. The upgrade improved performance, enhanced the user experience, and enabled closer integration with other Library services. It also reinforced the visibility, accessibility, and long-term preservation of EUI research outputs, ensuring wider dissemination and secure archiving.

The upgrade introduced several significant enhancements, including a fully responsive, mobile-friendly interface that improved search and browsing, customisable lists that could be created, managed, and shared, and integration with researchers' ORCID profiles. New statistics dashboards were implemented to provide deeper insight into usage data, such as most consulted publications, leading authors, and global readership patterns. In addition, entity-based navigation through authors, projects, and publications was introduced, supported by dedicated profile pages for all EUI members.

EUI Open Access

The [EUI Open Access Policy](#) encourages scholars to facilitate the widespread dissemination of their research by making their publications available in Cadmus, the EUI's Research Repository. An increasing proportion of publications in the repository are available in Open Access.

EUI Library's Open Access Publishing Agreements

The EUI publishing agreements waive the Open Access fees for EUI authors in over 9,000 journal titles published by Cambridge University Press, Elsevier, Springer and Wiley.

EUI corresponding authors can publish their journal articles in Open Access without paying any Article Processing Charge (APC). Since 2020, over 300 Open Access articles have been published by EUI members through the EUI Library publishing agreements.

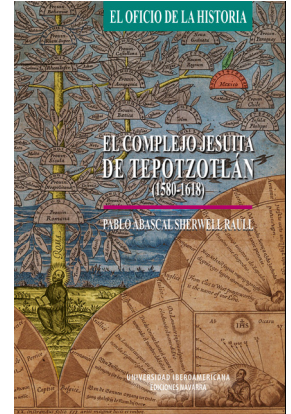

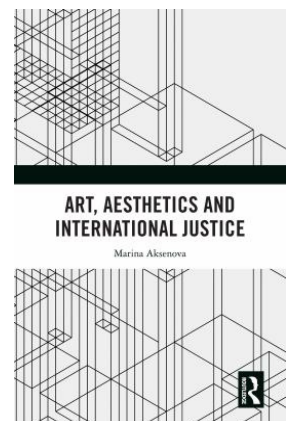

Art, aesthetics and international justice

Abingdon ; New York : Routledge, 2025,

This book demonstrates that art is implicit in the process of administration of international justice. The diverse nature of recent global threats as well as an overwhelming pull towards isolationism and nationalism challenge the dominant deterrence paradigm of international governance created in the aftermath of the Second World War. An alternative model is to focus on cooperation, and not deterrence, as a guiding operational principle. This volume focuses on the theoretical component linking justice with aesthetics as well as on the practical manifestation of such connection evident, inter alia, in the rhetoric of international courts, their architectural design and their commemorative practices expressed by the practice of symbolic reparations adopted by some of the courts. The underlying premise of the book is that international justice requires new vocabulary and new approaches, which can be derived from the study of aesthetics. It is held that exploring the aesthetical dimension of international justice contributes to the discussion on the foundations of its authority and the grounds for compliance with it. The work engages deeply with the theory of aesthetics developed by Immanuel Kant and Abhinavagupta, a Kashmiri critic, philosopher and scholar writing in the early eleventh century. The book will be of interest to academics and researchers working in the areas of Legal Philosophy, International Criminal Justice and International Law and International Relations.

The European Union is undergoing strategic redefinition through wartime conditions and shifting global orders, seeking to position itself as a geopolitical power. Enlargement and deeper integration are increasingly framed as instruments to achieve EU geopolitical goals. Since 2019, EU leaders have embraced the language of power and strategy, a shift



accelerated by Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine in 2022. Yet it remains unclear how the EU – an actor without a unified national interest or classic statehood – can operationalise a geopolitical agenda grounded in traditionally state-centric logics. How is the EU achieving power-maximising goals beyond its borders?

The Element identifies the logic of how the European Union (EU) has developed both in terms of the way the organization works and the way it has expanded to include new member states. It combines insights from the economic theories related to clubs and common-pool resources. The argument is that the EU may have started as a club, where members agreed to lose arrangements to generate and govern non-rivalrous goods from which only they could benefit, but it quickly evolved into a system of common-pool resources, where members have to manage rivalrous goods, the access to which cannot easily be refused to outsiders. That evolution was necessary to avoid the depletion of the goods EU member states depend on. The argument is illustrated through the evolution of the single market, the single currency, the single financial space, and security. This title is also available as Open Access on Cambridge Core.

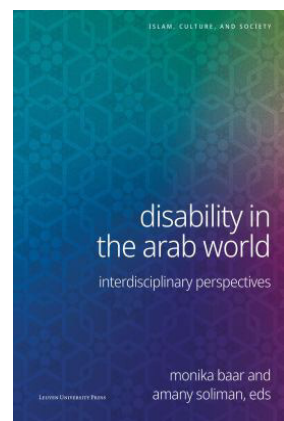
Disability in the Arab world : interdisciplinary perspectives

Interdisciplinary insights on disability in the MENA region according to the World Health Organization, around 16% of the world's population lives with a disability, and it is estimated that approximately 80% of them reside in the Global South. Nevertheless, research on persons with disabilities is typically limited to the Global North. This interdisciplinary volume, with contributions from psychology, sociology, history, linguistics, and development studies, addresses this discrepancy by providing new insights into disability in the Middle East and North Africa (MENA) region. While recognizing the significance of the medical approach, the authors seek to expand existing frameworks by including social, cultural and human rights perspectives. Engaging with both historical and contemporary contexts, Disability in the Arab World addresses issues such as the transmission and circulation of information in conventional and new media, and the colonial and postcolonial legacies affecting the study of disability.

In this GLOBALCIT forum debate, Kalypso Nicolaidis proposes a plan to

create a European Citizens' Assembly (ECA) with some major innovative features: the assembly should be permanent with rotating membership rather than devoted to a single issue for a limited period of time; it should be itinerant rather than located in Brussels, Strasbourg or Luxembourg; and it should have agenda-setting powers for the European Parliament that go beyond the consultative role of most national-level citizens' assemblies. In her opening essay, Nicolaidis elaborates and defends these and several other construction principles for an ECA. 19 responses by 23 authors engage critically with Nicolaidis' ideas and discuss the general merits and limitations of citizens' assemblies selected by lot. The collection concludes with a rejoinder by Nicolaidis, in which she does not so much attempt to rebut objections as to further develop her proposal in the light of arguments advanced in the debate.

Quando, nel gennaio 2023, è stata pubblicata in Russia la prima edizione di "La fine del regime", il libro è andato esaurito in pochi giorni e il suo autore è stato presto definito un «agente straniero» dalle autorità governative. I lettori non hanno avuto problemi a cogliere tra le righe che cosa l'autore, narrando la fine degli ultimi regimi dittatoriali nell'Europa occidentale, intendesse raccontare riguardo alla Russia di Putin, già in preda a un'involuzione che sembrava indirizzarla verso un destino simile. In questa nuova edizione, aggiornata per il pubblico internazionale, Baunov abbandona il linguaggio metaforico, usato per aggirare censure e divieti, e rende espliciti «quei parallelismi, quelle analogie e quelle differenze» che il lettore russo è in grado di comprendere immediatamente. Le risonanze con l'attualità sono molteplici: nel racconto del crollo della dittatura greca dopo il tentativo di annettere Cipro, che considerava una parte integrante del paese; nel collasso del regime portoghese, segnato da una guerra coloniale e imperialista protrattasi per anni; e infine nella prospettiva di speranza data dalla transizione democratica in Spagna, dove il cambiamento prese lentamente piede ed ebbe come protagonisti gli stessi membri dell'élite al potere. Con passo narrativo e la visione dello storico, Baunov offre preziosi strumenti per leggere il presente e per immaginare la fine della dittatura russa. L'auspicio, per la Russia e il mondo, è che la presa di coscienza di un passato governato da tragiche e fallimentari illusioni eviti all'umanità repliche future ancora peggiori.

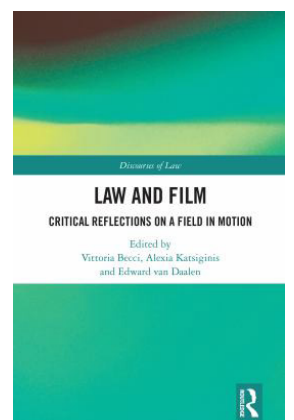
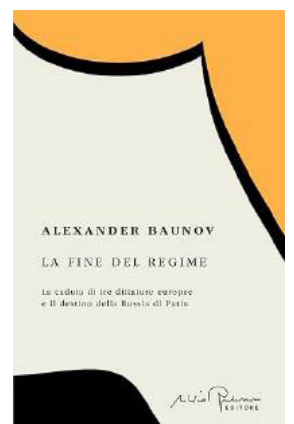

This book explores how law can be understood through film by engaging creatively with the intellectual and aesthetic dimensions of both fields. The contributors to this book consider the need to turn to film and what this means for how we come to understand law and its absences. The chapters explore a variety of narratives, aesthetics, cinematic epistemologies and legal phenomena; from assessing law in social debates to film as legal



critique, from notions of justice to contemplations on evil, and from masculine vigilantism to radical feminism. Taken together, they constitute an inspiring body of work that embodies an urgency for diverse and subversive ways to challenge law's formalism and authority; and to think about and respond variously to law's impotence, its disappointment, or its boredom. This book will appeal to legal scholars and students in law and the humanities, especially those with interests in aesthetics, law and literature, law and culture, law and society, and critical legal theory.

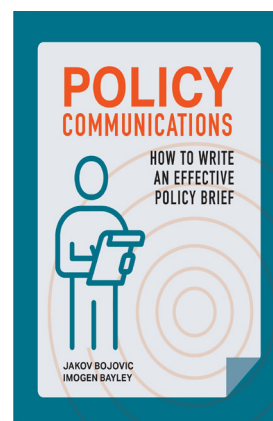
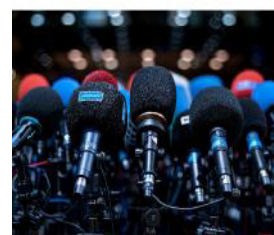

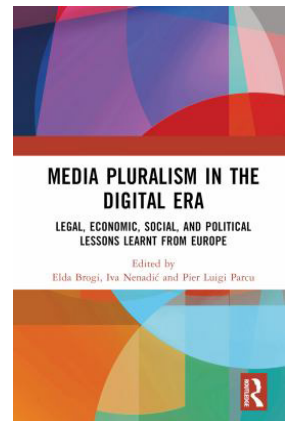

evolution of conditions and standards relevant for sustainable, free, and plural media and journalism in Europe in the last 10 years. Approaching the challenging and ever-changing concept of media pluralism from various complementary and sometimes conflicting angles, combining legal, economic, social, and political perspectives, chapters provide a holistic account of the concept of media pluralism, a key condition for a well-functioning democracy. This book draws on data from the Media Pluralism Monitor project, a scientific tool designed and implemented on a regular basis to document the health of media ecosystems, to provide insights into central dimensions of media systems across the EU and candidate countries. These include: the fundamental protection of freedom of expression, access to information, and safety of journalists; market plurality, transparency of ownership, media concentration, media viability, competition enforcement, and digital platforms' dominance; political independence, conflicts of interest, editorial autonomy, the role of media and digital platforms in elections, and independence of public service media; social inclusiveness, including access to media and representation of women, minorities, and people with disabilities; hate speech, disinformation, and media literacy. Offering a comprehensive overview of key areas of EU media policy, causes and solutions for the media economic struggle, and innovative examples of business models for journalism in the digital age, this book is recommended reading for advanced students and researchers of media policy and regulation, as well as policymakers.

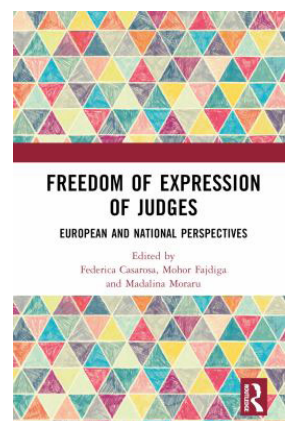

Freedom of expression of judges : European and national perspectives

This book addresses the impact of developments surrounding the freedom of expression of judges by building on the experience of judges themselves, legal practitioners and academics across Europe. Like everybody, judges enjoy freedom of expression. However, historically, there have been starker limitations to the free speech of judges compared to ordinary citizens, the rationale being to safeguard judicial independence, impartiality and public trust in the judiciary. Where exactly the boundary lies is a highly complex question. The recent developments in Europe have rekindled the dilemma of guaranteeing freedom of expression to judges. The rule of law crisis has led many judges to speak out against the attacks of autocratic governments



targeting judges and courts. The rapid expansion of the digital world has opened up new channels of communication, and the growing role of courts in society has expanded the reach of courts to practically any social issue, even the most polarised. This work critically analyses the recent jurisprudence of the Court of Justice of the EU and the European Court of Human Rights, its reception at the national level and the contribution of national judiciaries to the discussion pervading the European judicial space. It seeks to raise awareness that judicial speech is a multifaceted phenomenon shaped by complex legal and social considerations worth further exploration. The book will be of interest to academics, researchers, and policy-makers working in the areas of Human Rights Law, Constitutional Law and Politics, and Comparative Law.

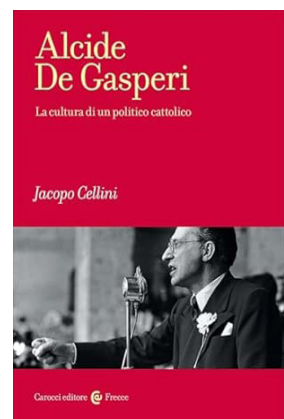

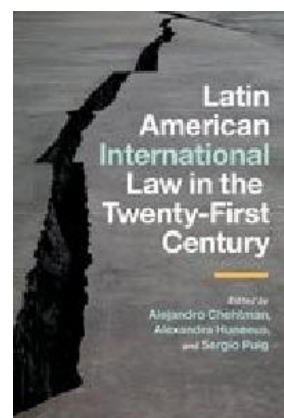

Latin America has been a pivotal site for influential and innovative developments in international law since the colonial era. Throughout much of the twentieth century, Latin American politics were entangled with the political and economic interests of the United States. Today, as the global order shifts, scholars and legal practitioners are grappling with the current restructuring and potential transformation of international relations—and what this means for international law in the region. Through the biographies and scholarship of Lasswell, McDougal, and New Haven School members, and using previously unexploited archival materials, the book explores how this body of legal theory was shaped and how it influenced the legal arguments made by McDougal and other members of the school in support of Cold War anti-communist policy positions and legal practice of the United States. The book shows that the New Haven School represented a specific anti-formalism and a collection of methods that characterized how American scholars and lawyers practised international law in the middle of the twentieth century, and still do today.

The past years have seen a number of crises, for example the Great Financial Crisis, the migration crisis, and the COVID-19 pandemic. As a reaction to these crises, EU rule-making in these fields has developed in various ways. These changes—essentially brought about only on the basis of secondary law—have had an institutional dimension; that is, they have concerned the actors involved in rule-making. Further dimensions of this change concern the cooperation with national bodies. In this vein, there has been a deviation in practice from the Dublin system as regards the distribution of refugees, and the EU has indebted itself on a considerable scale in the wake of the pandemic. This book provides an account of these developments with regard to each of the above policy fields, as well as in a horizontal perspective. Thereby, in a perspective combining legal and political science expertise, a comprehensive picture is drawn of the EU's regulatory crisis toolkit and its enrichment and refinement in reaction to new challenges.

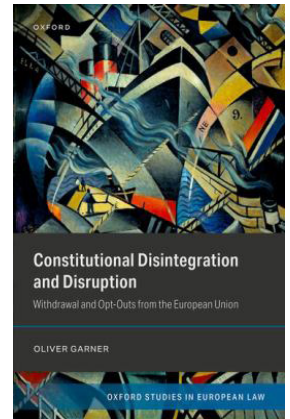

The United Kingdom's unprecedented withdrawal from the European Union in

2020 may be regarded as the first example of European 'disintegration'. This moment, however, was preceded by decades of 'disruption' as the United Kingdom, Ireland, and Denmark pursued opt-outs from the supranational constitutional order. This book presents the European Union as an order that is legitimated by individuals playing a dual role as both nationals of Member States and citizens of the Union; in turn, individuals are both democratic subjects and juridical objects. The EU Treaties have instituted a 'trptych' for the exercise of 'constituted constituent power': Article 49 TEU allowing accession, Article 48 TEU enabling amendment, and Article 50 TEU as a mechanism for the repatriation of power through withdrawal. Opt-outs are an iterative anomaly that have arisen through the retention of amendment power by representatives of Member State nationals. Reservations of constituent power have been operationalized in Protocols to the Treaties. By contrast, the withdrawal clause was proactively inserted into the Treaties as a sovereign right for Member State nationals subject to an orderly supranational procedure for the benefit of all EU citizens. The book presents narratives of disruption and disintegration that provide comprehensive historical overviews of how opt-outs and withdrawal arose and developed. It concludes with criticism of the consequences of these phenomena for individuals, and proposes reforms to the EU Treaties that would enable citizens to more fully realize their dual role in the European constitutional space.

Questions about whether, where, how, and with whom to organize European security and defense policy have been on the agendas of national governments many times. Over the last seven decades or so, manifold ideas have been proposed, demonstrating that European security and defense policy can be organized in different ways. Actors have debated and (dis)agreed over who is considered a beneficiary of European security and defense initiatives, how to assure security/defense and against what/whom, and in what way to relate the many organizations that address European security and defense policy to one another. While some of their proposals remained only that, others were formally ratified and implemented. This myriad of proposals and organizational innovations encapsulate different security visions and approaches. In this forum, we take stock of recent security and defense developments that have occurred in the name of and in Europe. We address the questions of how European security and defense is organized in and across individual states, as well as in multilateral security and defense organizations since Russia's invasion of Ukraine and the US's



decreasing commitment to invest in European security. We furthermore inquire what is at stake for actors in the European security and defense realm, e.g., how do they position themselves vis-à-vis other powerful actors such as the US, China, or Russia? To answer these questions, this collection distinguishes between four types of actors: architects, bricoleurs, agnostics, and spoilers. What distinguishes these actors are their different degrees of engagement and investment with European security and defense issues; alongside substantive preferences, they differ in how they define political stakes, what compromises they are willing to make, and what capacities are available to them.

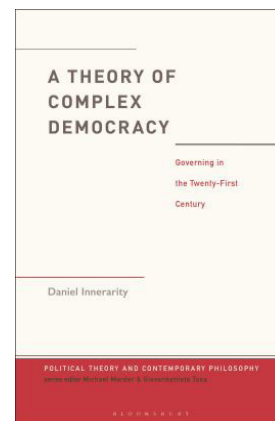

Do our political systems and democracies really reflect the complex reality of the 21st century? Or does politics seem to be legislating about yesterday's world? If democracy has made the transition from the polis to the nation-state, from direct democracy to representative democracy, there is no reason to suppose that it cannot face new challenges, as long as it is provided with an adequate political architecture. Drawing on a broad range of sources, including classical and contemporary theorists, *A Theory of Complex Democracy* presents a new theory of democracy and government for the 21st century, a theory that starts from the premise that the most promising rejuvenation of our democracies is to make them more complex.

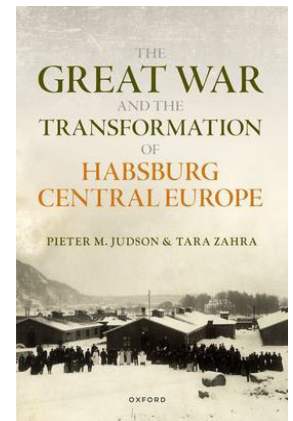

The Great War and the Transformation of Habsburg Central Europe examines how the First World War transformed the multinational Austro-Hungarian Monarchy into a fractured landscape of mistrust, scarcity, and dissolution and laid the foundation for the new postwar world. The outcome of the war is not, it argues, evidence of the inherent fragility of multinational polities, and Austria-Hungary was not inevitably doomed to collapse on the eve of the war. Instead, it contends that the Habsburg state laid the groundwork for its own dissolution by turning on its citizens. By imposing military rule, suspending civil rights, fostering suspicions among its citizens based on the languages they spoke, and failing to secure enough food to feed the population, the Habsburg state both created new and exacerbated existing regional, local, religious, and national antagonisms. Over time, severe hardships on the home front, in occupied territories, and in refugee and prisoner-of-war camps spurred widespread resentment and eroded loyalty to the monarchy. But even as the Empire frayed, the war inspired innovative institutions, social welfare measures, and new understandings of citizenship that continued to influence postwar Europe. The book analyzes these experiences at multiple scales—local, imperial, and international—to demonstrate the shared transregional experiences of women, workers, and children and to emphasize the close interconnections between the social and cultural history of the Empire to its political, economic, and military history.

The European Court of Justice plays a key role in the interpretation and enforcement of EU law. Yet, we still know little about the conditions under which cases arrive at the Court via preliminary reference and why they are so unevenly distributed across the EU Member States. Previous studies have shown how the legal elites played a central role in feeding the Court with cases to increase their power and influence. Legal Mobilization for Migrant Rights tells a different story. Focusing on the migration domain, this book shows that EU litigation can also be used to defend powerless groups. To explore the conditions under which EU legal mobilization for migrants emerges, the book compares three countries where EU migration law was mobilized before the European Court of Justice (Italy, the United Kingdom, and the Netherlands) and one where it was not (Greece). 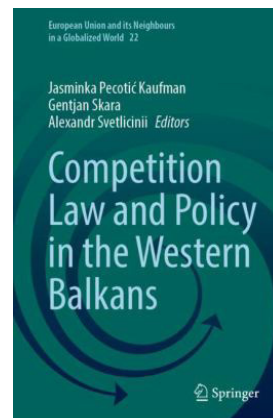

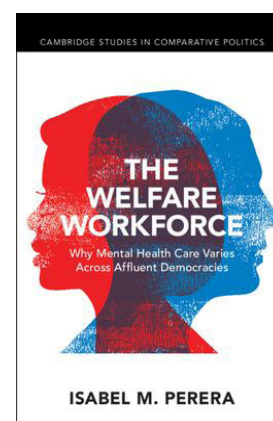

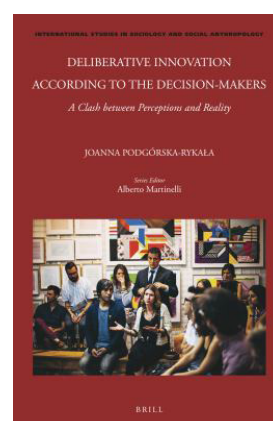

The fall of the Berlin Wall and the Soviet Union restructured the map of Europe and encouraged the United States to turn toward China. However, Vladimir Putin's attempt to revive a Soviet-style version of security by invading Ukraine has stimulated aid to Ukraine as it fights a proxy war to protect the security of Europe. Looking ahead, Rose asks whether European governments are able to defend themselves as America's commitment to Europe becomes less reliable; the challenge to Europe of helping fund the reconstruction of Ukraine; questions the conditions in which the European Union and NATO could admit Ukraine as a member; and sets out where Britain fits in as a NATO but not an EU member-state.

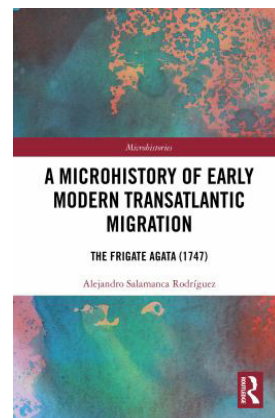

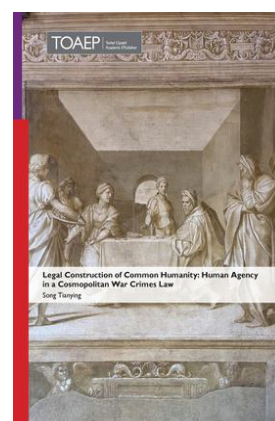

The project of a cosmopolitan war crimes law seeks to make law "morally meaningful". Subject to changing political and social conditions, legal rules and practices are inevitably complex, fragmentary and often inconsistent. In contrast to the "transient, unstructured, pragmatic" legal reality is legal philosophy's never-ending effort to find "system and coherence in legal doctrine". One of the important rationalization tasks for legal philosophers is to find moral meaning in rules. It would be "self-defeating" for law to claim only legality and not "moral correctness" or justice. The claim to correctness is integral to any norm as "justificatory reasons". For law not to be "mere abstraction" or an alien imposition, it must have moral content. For this purpose, moral and political theories can offer a certain "valuational frame of



reference” or “matrix of justice”. Internal moral meaning is central to criminal law which proclaims social solidarity in vital moral issues.

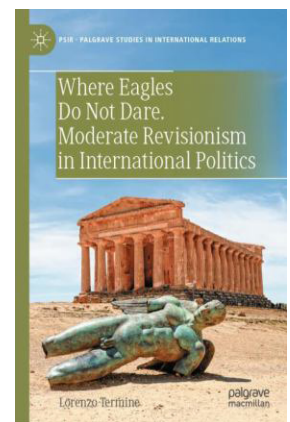

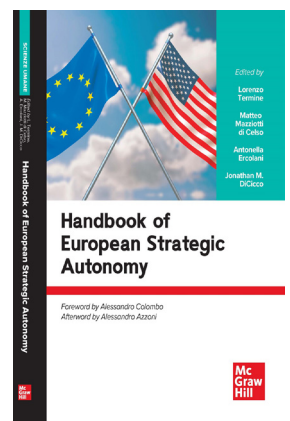

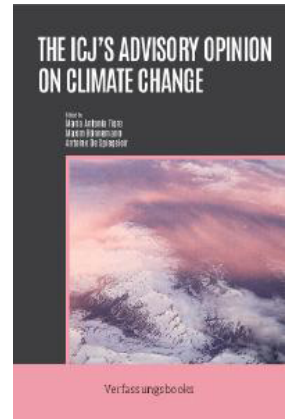

This book tells the unlikely story of how the European Union survived COVID-19, which came on the heels of a difficult decade during which the EU wrestled with repeated crises, from the Euro area, to refugees, populism, and geopolitics. Against all odds, a divided polity with a weak center and low competences in crucial policy domains, managed to overcome powerful disincentives to coordinate its way out of the pandemic and built central capacity. We argue that this puzzling outcome stems from COVID-19's crisis characteristics and the EU's polity features. The relative symmetric nature of the pandemic and the deeply disruptive economic shocks revealed the potential long-term externalities of a lack of joint action at the European level. The EU suspended the fiscal and state aid rules, coordinated a common vaccine procurement scheme, and pooled its fiscal firepower. Our polity perspective shows how the EU overcame conflicts and managed to coordinate and create new capacity in its center while relying on a new geography of solidarity within the EU. The polity approach allows us to show how the EU did not take a federal path to polity formation. Instead, it moved toward a polity that serves as an imperfect but solidaristic safety net for its member states. Our polity approach offers a more fine-grained argument than "more or less integration" through a triptych of concepts (bonding, i.e., solidarity, binding, i.e., capacity building and bounding, i.e., bordering) that capture both the supply and demand side of politics.

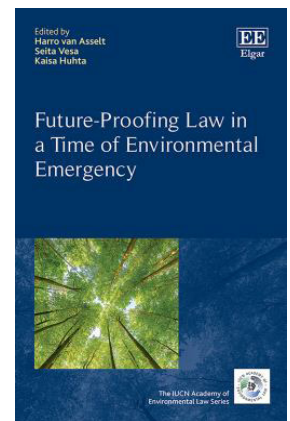

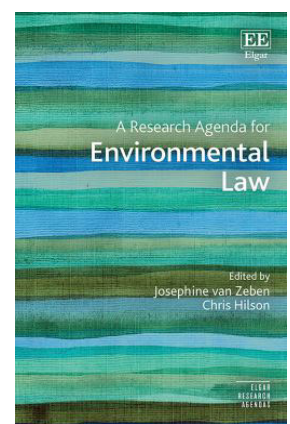

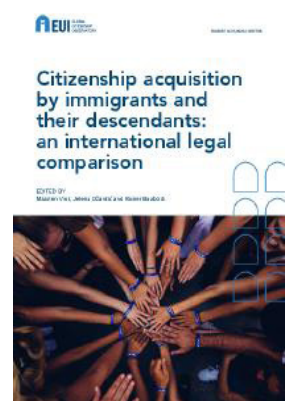

Schools tend to be segregated based on socio-economic status (SES), raising concerns about unequal educational opportunities and the broader impact on civic engagement and social cohesion. A key factor contributing to school segregation is that families from different socio-economic backgrounds face unequal opportunities to exert choice and express different preferences for schooling. This dissertation examines socio-economic disparities in secondary school choice in the Netherlands, focusing on two underexplored aspects: educational differentiation and the peer context. The findings reveal that school choice is socially stratified in multiple ways, with families of different SES backgrounds making other decisions regarding a school’s track offer, ability grouping practices, and, in some cases, specialized profiles. Furthermore, school choice is a social decision. Understanding (socio-economic disparities in) school choice requires looking beyond isolated family-level choice processes and considering the peer context in which preferences for schooling develop. While peer networks can help mitigate educational disadvantages for lower SES students, their segregated nature limits this compensatory effect. Lower SES students appear more susceptible to network effects in school choice but are also less likely to be part of resource-rich primary school networks due to segregation between and within schools. These findings underscore the need for school desegregation and integration efforts to promote equality of educational opportunities.

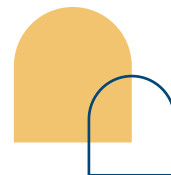
