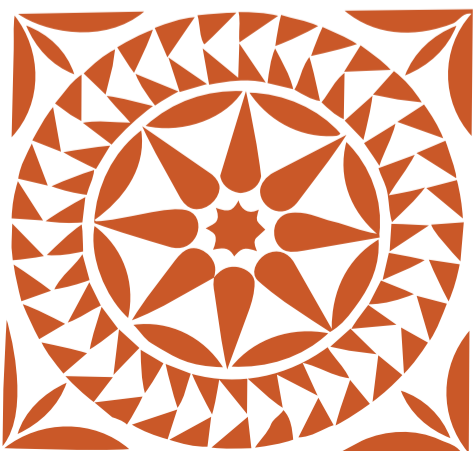
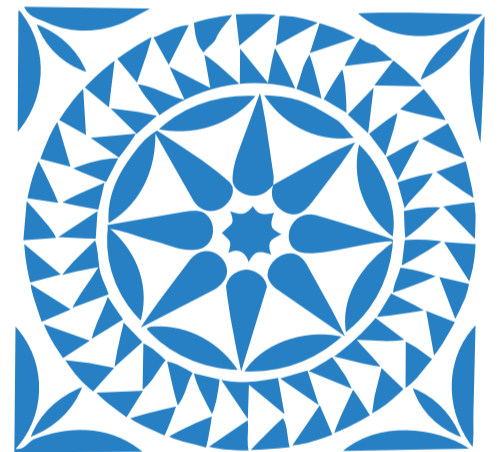

CADMUS AND OPEN ACCESS AT THE EUI

The **18th edition of the EUI Directory of Academic Publications and Data** provides a consolidated overview of the research outputs produced by the **European University Institute** academic community in **2025**.

The Directory includes publications and data across all departments and research centres of the Institute. It supports institutional transparency, research visibility, and evidence-based reporting on the scholarly activity of the EUI.

This edition also marks an important milestone as the Institute approaches its **50th anniversary**, while completing the **first full year of operation of the new Cadmus**, the EUI's institutional research repository.

Core research infrastructure

Cadmus, the EUI's research repository, remains a central infrastructure supporting this mission. With nearly 33,000 records, including publications, datasets, and videos, the repository ensures long-term preservation and global accessibility of EUI research. The successful migration to DSpace7 in May 2025 enhanced system performance, user experience, interoperability, and integration with services such as ORCID, while introducing improved search functionality and advanced usage statistics.

The Role of the EUI Library and Open Science Support

The **EUI Library** plays a key enabling role in supporting research dissemination and institutional reporting through repository management, Open Science guidance, and publishing agreements with major academic publishers. These services ensure that EUI research outputs are:

- Visible and accessible worldwide
- Compliant with institutional and European Open Science requirements
- Reliably recorded for institutional reporting and evaluation
- Preserved for long-term scholarly use

Open Access Publishing Support

Open Access publishing agreements allow EUI authors to publish research outputs without paying individual article processing charges. The library sustains these agreements through adherence. This model supports:

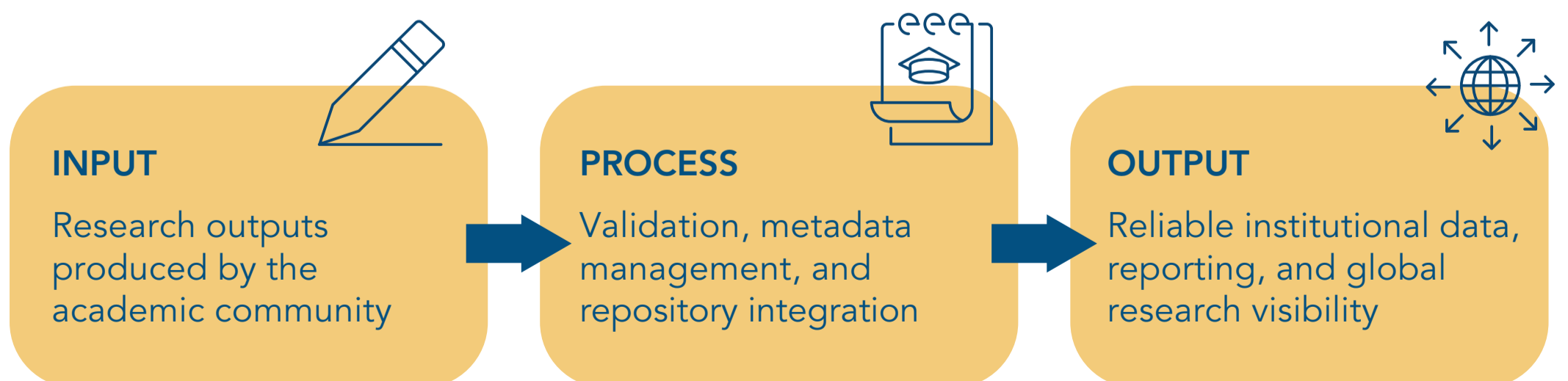
- Cost-efficient dissemination of research

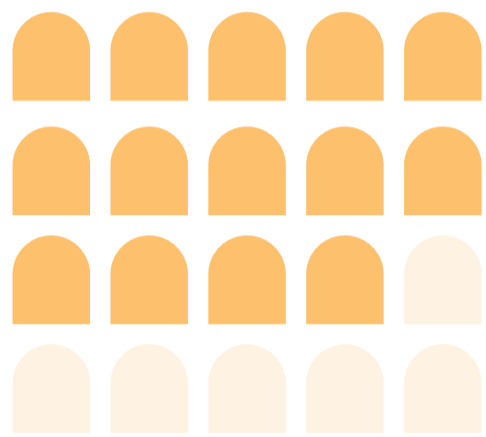


EUI ACADEMIC PUBLICATIONS AND DATA 2025
