# Publish in Open Access with the EUI



Open Access (OA) is the free, immediate, online access to the results of scholarly research, and the right to use and re-use those results as needed.

## Why to publish in Open Access?

Broader visibility and impact  
Accelerated discovery  
Public enrichment

The [EUI Open Access Policy](#) encourages scholars to facilitate the widespread dissemination of their research by making their publications available in Open Access.

## Open Access publishing options

### Gold Open Access

Publish directly in Open Access with the publisher

### Green Open Access

Self-archive a version of your publication in an institutional repository

### Gold Open Access

This option usually involves quite a high cost for the author.

The EUI Library supports the members of the EUI academic community in their efforts to publish Open Access through 'transformative agreements' with publishers, waiving the publishing fee for EUI authors.

The transformative agreements can waive the Open Access publishing fees usually charged to the author in nearly 7,000 journal titles published by:

### Green Open Access

Make your work available in **Cadmus, the EUI Research Repository**.

Check your journal's and publisher's self-archiving policy via Open Policy Finder:  
<https://openpolicyfinder.jisc.ac.uk/>

Submit your publications to Cadmus, sending the information/details of it and adding the allowed version (articles and chapters) with full-text according to the journal or publisher.

The Library Open Science Office staff will make the publication available Open Access in Cadmus.
