

FINDING ERESOURCES

WHAT IT IS

Using the EUI Library catalogue, you can find electronic journals (eJournals), journal articles, and eBooks. You can search for eResources by title, author(s), subject, or ISSN/ISBN.


STEPS

LOCATING THE JOURNAL SEARCH TAB

From the [Library catalogue](#), access the [Journal Search tool](#) at the top centre of the page. Enter the journal title or ISSN. You can refine the search to select for eJournals by using the option on the left for Available Online.

- To search for resources:
 - Enter the Title, Subject area or Author(s) in the Library catalogue [Search box](#).
 - As you type, prompts will appear in a drop-down list; you may select one of the searches suggested (Library print and online collections, Journal articles and book chapters, or Cadmus, EUI repository) or search all the Library's holdings using the Everything option.
 - Once you hit Search, you will be brought to a screen with Search Results based upon the terms you entered.

STEPS

WORKING WITH YOUR RESULTS

- To refine and work with your results:
 - Under Refine my results in the left column, results can be refined to select eResources by selecting the Available Online option
 - Next, you may use the other limiters to refine content: Availability, Resource Type, Date of Publication, Subject, Language, and/or New in Library
 - You may share search results using the option to copy a permalink or send them via email.
- Remember:
 - For each eBook or eJournal, you may have more than one access option depending upon which providers, publishers and/or databases hold the resource.
 - When searching for eJournals, pay attention to the different access options and the years and/or volumes covered, as well as any warnings and/or icons attached to a resource's record. For example, Open Access resources are usually identified by an icon.
 - If you encounter any problems accessing eResources, fill out the [Report Access Problem](#) form.

DEFINITIONS*

- eBook: short for electronic book; a digital form of a book, published to be read on a screen; books may be born digital or available in both print and electronic formats.
- eJournal: short for electronic journal; a digital form of a journal, published to be read on a screen; journals may be born digital or available in both print and electronic formats.
- eResource: short for electronic resource; any library resource available in electronic format.
- ISSN: the International Standard Serial Number is an 8-digit code used to identify newspapers, journals, magazines and periodicals of all kinds and in both print and electronic media.
- ISBN: the International Standard Book Number is a 10 digit or 13 digit number used to identify books and/or individual sections (such as chapters) of books or issues or individual articles from journals, periodicals or serials.
- Subject: the publisher-assigned topic or disciplinary area used to group resources.



TIP

To access EUI Library-licensed eResources such as eBooks, eJournals, digitized newspapers and databases, from off campus, you will need to use your EUI email address (username) and password.
