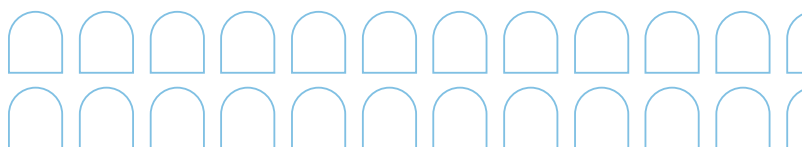

Private Actors in Digital Governance

 **24 - 25 February**  **Florence** **€1,000**

Main trainers: Madeleine De Cock Buning (STG); Lisa Clare Ginsborg (STG)

Rapid changes in politics and public opinion are impacting the regulatory complexity of the digital media environment. As a result, the rights and interests of citizens are under increasing threat around the world. Can large and powerful private companies be trusted to govern in a socially responsible manner which is in the best interests of the global citizenry both online and offline?

Participants will have the opportunity to explore and better understand the different possible regulatory models (state regulation, self-regulation, and co-regulation) while debating the pros and cons of involving private entities in regulation and enforcement (bottom-up) over purely public (top-down) law arrangements.

Climate Risk Academy

 21 February - 18 March  Online €950 - €1,350

This Climate Risks Online Academy co-organized by Oliver Wyman and the Florence School of Banking and Finance (EUI), in scientific cooperation with the EUI's School of Transnational Governance, combines the expertise and tools of the financial industry to assess and grasp the risks posed by climate change to the financial sector.

Instead of examining how the risk landscape has been altered by climate change, the Academy will review practical approaches for quantifying their impact and explore best practices for integrating climate risk into both prudential and risk management frameworks. This online Academy has been designed for staff members of financial institutions, micro-prudential and macro-prudential authorities who wish to deeply understand the crucial risks that climate change pose to the financial system. In addition to providing topical content and practical tools, this online Academy will also act as a platform to stimulate exchange and debate between public officials, academics and private practitioners.

High Quality Regulation: Tools and Practice

 7 - 10 March  Florence €1,200

Main trainers: Claudio Radaelli (STG); Andrea Renda (STG)

This 4-day executive training course will cover both the dimension of regulatory analysis and the practice of governing rules across the policy life cycle. A large part of the curriculum will focus on the integration of operational lessons from real-world experience alongside the 'better regulation agenda' of many different countries. The course will also delve into the assessment of multi-annual research programmes funded by the European Research Council (ERC).

Participants will learn how the 2021 Communication of the European Commission on better regulation will be implemented across the EU and its member states, while also addressing various impacts on accession countries and the rest of the world. The learning format will include case studies, lectures, and testimonies designed by the Florence School of Regulation (FSR) Energy & Climate.

Digital Platforms: Towards a Comprehensive Policy Framework

 22 - 25 March  Online €1,200

Main trainers: Andrea Renda (STG); Nicolas Petit (RSCAS, Law Department)

Digital platforms have become a focal point in policy conversations across the world. However, their regulation has only recently been added to the discussion, since online intermediaries have remained largely unregulated. The result is a complex policy discussion, not so much about "whether" to regulate digital platforms, but rather, on the difficulty of reaching consensus on "what", "how" and "who" to regulate. After the training, participants will have a better understanding of how platforms operate, how they create value, and how they can potentially act anti-competitively. They will also have the opportunity to learn about the evolving economic and technological features of digital platforms and their prospective benefits and risks for the economy and society, especially in the context of a growing use of sophisticated Artificial Intelligence (AI) techniques which often escape the ability of regulators to monitor the market.

Responsible Negotiations Across Nations

This 3-day training is designed to address the challenges of complex interactions and communications across cultures and sectors, by availing itself of interactive case study engagement across multiple stakeholders. Participants will benefit from a hands-on systematic framework that will help them prepare, conduct and debrief complex international negotiations and achieve successful outcomes. Through role-play, case analyses and global best practices, participants will also strengthen their skills in transnational contexts, therefore becoming more aware of their personal negotiation style, enabling them to influence others in a more responsible manner.

Making Sanctions Work: Political and Legal Challenges of EU Restrictive Measures

 22,26,28 - 29 April  Online & Florence €1,000

Main trainers: Fabrizio Tassinari (STG); Petra Mahnič (Council of the EU); Juan Ignacio Signes de Mesa (CJEU)

EU restrictive measures, or sanctions, are one of the most significant tools of Common Foreign and Security Policy (CFSP). However, their adoption and application carry complex political and legal challenges. Over the course of this 5-day blended training course, top legal experts, academics, and practitioners will share detailed knowledge on the political and legal aspects of EU restrictive measures, some of which include their political and legal nature, the mechanisms whereby they become law, the practical implications and challenges concerning their enforcement, and the judicial review ensured by the Courts of the EU, their impact on developing common EU norms and principles and fundamental rights protection, their effectiveness and legitimacy, their placement within the EU's external policy, their geopolitical potential.

Open Society University Network (OSUN)

Open to Health (O2H): A Pandemic Training Response to Rebuild Resilience

Long-term programme

This project has been designed within the context of a partnership between the European University Institute and the Universidad de los Andes. The aim of the partnership is to deliver executive education and professional training in the critical areas of health and health governance over a three-year period. The courses will contribute to rebuilding and strengthening public health systems' capacities, with a particular emphasis on low and middle-income countries to design better prospects for global health governance vis-à-vis the training of a new generation of professionals who will be able to navigate the intersecting fields of governance and public health.

Acting as a 'hub,' the two lead institutions (the European University Institute and the Universidad de los Andes) will draw upon other partner institutions in the OSUN network and beyond and provide expert contributions to support specifically designed training courses. The full programme is currently under development and all courses are expected to launch in mid-2022. The STG will be specifically designing and delivering the module on "Global Health: Negotiating a New Pandemic Treaty" which will explore the process and content foundation necessary to design and implement a new pandemic convention aimed at strengthening global health security. This O2H programme will soon be open for registration to participants with a focus on the health sector.

Migration Communication Strategies: Effective Approaches to Depolarise the Debate

Migration is a controversial topic and one that is difficult to discuss without being accused of spreading fake news or provoking heated debates. As a result, there is growing uncertainty as to how to design migration communication strategies that are effective in changing attitudes for the better. With an aim to strengthen and fine-tune communication skills around this delicate subject, participants will interact with one another to identify, share and understand the key challenges and best practices impacting migration communications today. Participants will also be invited to debate recent topical research and apply recent findings to real-life migration communications campaigns across various regions of the world.

This executive training course aims to shed light on the black box of policymaking within the European Commission. It is practice-oriented and it will be delivered by former members of the Commission services, including former President Jose Manuel Barroso, experienced academics, and campaigners who have engaged with it across a host of areas. In addition to the latest data, case studies, and policy developments, participants will also learn skills for engaging with the Commission: how to effectively contribute to the public consultation process; how to write policy memos and position papers aimed at the Commission; how to follow the Commission's cycle and do proper audience mapping within the Commission.

Being a policy entrepreneur is not easy: it takes time, commitment, passion and sometimes a Machiavellian understanding of how networks of influence operate. However, becoming a policy entrepreneur who drives meaningful change is different depending on the characteristics of the policy problem and whether it is based inside government or outside of government, such as within media, academia, a think tank or an interest group. This blended training provides participants with an opportunity to examine and expand the range of skills and strategies that individuals and organizations need to advance new policy ideas that bring about real change. Delivered by successful policy entrepreneurs and leading academics, the training will start online and continue in a historic Medici palace in the centre of Florence.

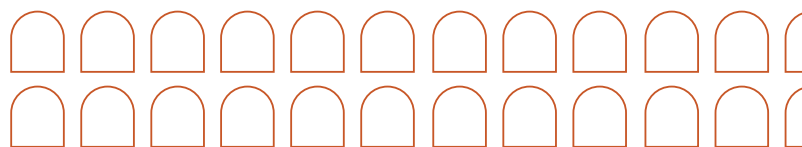
ETGN Summer School on Agile Governance

Effective Migration Management: Putting Policy into Action

 **October 2022**

Main trainers: Andrew Geddes (MPC); Lorenzo Piccoli (MPC)

This training develops and strengthens participants' migration management skills. It explores the different stages of migration management from managing evidence to decision-making processes and to implementation. It will offer officers and practitioners working in the field of migration with a holistic approach, looking at the issue of migration management from different perspectives and across different key themes in order to share knowledge and upgrade key expertise. By the end of the training, participants will have developed a sophisticated understanding of the complexities, challenges, and trade-offs of migration management.

Different Plans, Common Challenges: Implementation of the NGEU National Recovery & Resilience Plans

 **November 2022**

This interactive executive course enables participants to better comprehend the critical issues in the practical implementation of the National Recovery and Resilience Plans (NRRPs). The course analyses key "on the ground" issues, such as national administration capacities, loans, performance indicators, timelines, reporting, and evaluation. These topics particularly revolve around the required joint implementation of reforms and investments throughout the RRP, as well as digital and green transition. This course will serve both as a platform for participants to discuss the common challenges of implementing NRRPs across Europe, therefore fostering a "community of practice" as well as providing a forum for sharing concerns and experiences with EU officials.

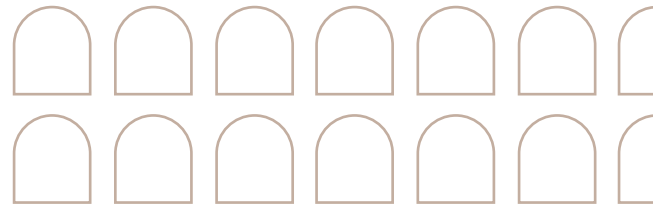
Effective Governance Strategies for Sustainable Finance in Emerging Markets

 **Autumn 2022**

The drive for sustainable development, corporate sustainability, and responsible business practices is reshaping the economic landscape, attracting regulatory attention, creating new business opportunities, changing financial markets, and financing landscape. Developing a competitive, responsible, and sustainable organisation requires strong strategy, organisational values and leadership to drive forward innovation and change. This course is addressing two kinds of professionals. On the one hand, sustainable finance organisations and professionals from the global north will gain a better appreciation of the needs of the global south and how to respond appropriately to them. On the other hand, the course will also empower organisations and professionals from the global south to be more creative in adapting the global sustainable finance trends, techniques, and practices to their local contexts.

Webinar: The Legal Challenges, Implementation, and Legacy Issues Lying Ahead for Next Generation EU

Workshop: Crisis Management for European City Senior Executives

This workshop is designed to present an overview of crisis management techniques and cases, along with best – and worst – practices concerning a variety of urban issue areas. The aim of the workshop is to enhance the capacity of senior executives from European cities to manage current and future crises in a cost effective manner, while increasing both the resilience and effectiveness of public administration and management at the local level. The programme also serves as an introduction to a potential broader series of workshops that will address key cross-cutting issues of urban policy and transnational governance. The format will begin with a public panel and will take place during The of State of the Union (SOU) conference at the European University Institute.

Study Visit for the Finnish Institute of Public Administration

11-13 May | For the Finnish Institute of Public Administration

Within the context of a study-visit to Florence, this initiative offers a set of workshops touching on all core areas examined at the School of Transnational Governance and will take place alongside visits, group discussions, and a rich social programme.
