

Research missions, traineeships and study visits at the European Parliament

In the framework of a partnership agreement between the European Parliament and the EUI that was signed in 2014, the EP offers various possibilities to EUI doctoral researchers and postdoctoral fellows who would like to conduct part of their research at the EP or to familiarise themselves with the work of the EP. This agreement covers research missions, traineeships, and study visits.

Doctoral researchers interested in applying need to follow the following procedures (adopted by the EUI Academic Council on 11 March 2015). Postdocs should contact Judith Przyrowski (email Judith.Przyrowski@eui.eu).

Research Mission

Research missions are unpaid, but logistic support is provided by the EP. Interested researchers should obtain the approval of their supervisor and the Department and send a motivation letter and a short description of their research project to the Academic Service (email Judith.Przyrowski@eui.eu). The request will be forwarded to the EP administration. Once approved by the EP, considering duration and timing of the mission, the request will be submitted to the EUI Entrance Board for approval.

Robert Schuman Traineeships

Traineeships are paid and are awarded for a period of five months at the EP in Brussels. Interested researchers should apply using the normal EP procedure after having received the approval of their supervisor and the Department. Researchers who applied for a traineeship should inform the Academic Service by sending a motivation letter and a short description of their research project to Judith Przyrowski (email Judith.przyrowski@eui.eu). Once the traineeship is approved by the EP, the request will be submitted to the EUI Entrance Board for approval.

Study Visit

Study visits give the opportunity for more detailed study of specific subjects relating to European integration for a period up to one month. Interested researchers should apply using the normal EP procedure.
