

1. **TEACHING ASSISTANT ; Mediterranean Food and Culture.** This History and Civilization course taught by Dr. Peter Fischer, who received his PhD from the EUI. There are two sections of it that meet twice per week, on Mondays and Wednesdays, starting at 15:15. The duties would include grading some student work (mostly discussion and blog posts and other small assignments) and attending class semi-regularly. Students are American undergraduate students from all fields of study. The length of contract is from September 1 to December 20 2022, with a possibility of renewal for the second semester. Approximately 5 hours of work per week, including occasionally attending the class once per week. Compensation is 1800 euros gross. This is an excellent mentoring opportunity for PhD researchers in their third or fourth year to learn how a course at an American institution is conceived and delivered. Deadline: 1 August 2022
2. **TEACHING ASSISTANT : Cross-Cultural Communication in the Global Workplace** is a course taught by the Center Director, Sasha Perugini. The course meets on Mondays and Wednesdays at 13:30 for 90 minutes. The duties would include grading some student work (mostly discussion and blog posts and other small assignments) and attending class semi-regularly. Students are American undergraduate students primarily from communication and business related fields. The length of contract is from September 1 to December 20 2022, with a possibility of renewal for the second semester. Approximately 5 hours of work per week, including occasionally attending the class once per week. Compensation is 1800 euros gross. This is an excellent mentoring opportunity for PhD researchers in their third or fourth year, and given that the supervisor is the Program Director, an excellent opportunity to gain understanding in how a study abroad program functions. 3. **TEACHING ASSISTANT** Two courses taught by the same professor, Simone Anselmi. One course is called **Made in Italy** and focuses on luxury branding and marketing, and the other is on **Entrepreneurship in Emerging Enterprises**. Students are American undergraduate students primarily from business related fields. The length of contract is from September 1 to December 20 2022, with a possibility of renewal for the second semester. Approximately 5 hours of work per week, including occasionally attending the class once per week. Compensation is 1800 euros gross. 4. **NEW COURSE.** We are seeking candidates to construct a new course for the Spring Semester 2023, focusing on **Fascism from Italian Futurism to the Present Day**. Candidates should be in the fifth or sixth year, with their doctoral viva imminent. Previous teaching or co-teaching experience in a related subject is preferred but not absolutely required. The selected candidate will work with the Pedagogy and Curriculum specialist to develop and deliver the course in a manner that meets the standards of Syracuse University. Courses at Syracuse typically meet twice per week for 90 minutes per session. The length of contract is from January 5 to April 20 2023, and the compensation is approximately 6000 euros gross.
