**Length of contract and % of full-time:** Start date 1 April 2011 (to be confirmed), duration 2 years, full time.

**Salary** The net monthly salary for a full-time (30/30) contract will be approx. euro 2,000. In addition, when conditions as laid down by the Statute are applicable, there are family allowances - household allowance, dependent child allowance, education allowance – and expatriation allowance (approx. 16% of salary). For contracts of at least 12 months or prolonged beyond 12 months, an amount equivalent to 16,5% of the basic salary will be paid upon termination of service as severance.
