<b>Title of project:</b>	Migration Policy Centre (MPC)
<b>Job description:</b>	Prospects for International Migration Governance (MIGPROSP) is a 5-year project (2014-19) funded by an Advanced Grant of the European Research Council awarded to Professor Andrew Geddes. MIGPROSP analyses the drivers of migration governance in four regions (Asia-Pacific, Europe, North America and South America). The project explores how and with what effects 'actors' (e.g. political leaders, policy-makers, NGOs) in migration governance systems in each of the four regions understand the causes and effects of international migration and how these, in turn, are shaped by understandings of key risks and uncertainties. The Research Fellow will contribute to the interviewing of policy actors, organisation of project-related events, the analysis of data and to the publication of material linked to the project. Applications would be particularly welcomed from applicants with expertise on migration

	governance in the Asia-Pacific, North America or South America regions.
