Department:	Robert Schuman Centre for Advanced Studies, Migration Policy Centre (MPC)
Length of contract and % of full-time:	Full-time, one year, starting as soon as possible. The contract car be further renewed several times up to a total of 5 years (including the first contract period).

Title of project:	Global Mobility Database at the Migration Policy Centre (MPC)
Job description:	The Research Assistant is expected to contribute to the construction of a Global Mobility Database (GMD). The database shall comprise four layers/dimensions: demographic, sociological, legal-political and economic. For each dimension, data shall be collected on country-to-country flows and regulations in a diachronic perspective. The Research Assistant will search, collect and organize data suited to cover the different aspects of international mobility in a systematic way, tapping public and private sources, primarily but not exclusively via internet-generated data and international organization archives. Additionally, the Research Assistant will collaborate to the analysis of the database employing state-of-the art statistica techniques and contribute to the publication of results in coordination with the GMD project and the MPC directors.

Qualifications:	 PhD in sociology/social sciences, possibly with a focus on international mobility, migration, transnationalism and their governance; Experience of quantitative research methods, including access and use of web-generated data and data retrieval from large data archives; Publications in the field of international mobility and transnationalism are appreciated; Strong academic and analytical profile, ability to take initiative, problem-solving attitude, and an interest in developing interdisciplinary research that addresses long-term social changes and real-world problems; Strong academic potential, proven by previous research activities; Capacity of communicating ideas both at academic conferences and in policy workshops.
