Title of project:	CRITEVENTS: Critical Life Events and the Dynamics of Inequality: Risk, Vulnerability, and Cumulative Disadvantage
Job description:	The appointee will work as a (postdoctoral) researcher as part of CRITEVENTS (90 %), and as an editorial assistant for Advances in Life Course Research (10 %).
	<u>CRITEVENTS</u> : 'Critical Life Events and the Dynamics of Inequality: Risk, Vulnerability, and Cumulative Disadvantage" (2017-2020) is a consortium of researchers from Amsterdam, EUI, Lausanne, Oxford, and Stockholm, and is funded by Norface.
	CRITEVENTS studies the impact of two critical life events – job loss and union dissolution – on the life trajectories of adults and their children. Within this framework, the appointee is expected to develop research—in collaboration with Professor Härkönen—that focuses on a) the (changing) social stratification in the risk of union dissolution and explanations of this change, or b) the effects of job loss and union dissolution on adults and their children, and the heterogeneity in these effects. The results of this research will be submitted for publication in leading sociological and demographic journals.
	The position also involves minor project management tasks. Research visits to the other partner institutions are possible.
	Advances in Life Course Research is an interdisciplinary journal that publishes research on the human life course and is edited by Juho Härkönen and Laura Bernardi. The appointee will assist

	Härkönen with his editorial tasks.
Place of work:	Florence
Qualifications:	The successful applicant is at the time of appointment expected to have, or be very close to completing, a doctoral degree in sociology, demography, or a related social science discipline.
	In addition to the above, s/he is able to document high-quality research that shows a) knowledge of the fields of research that are relevant to the project, b) strong skills in analysis of large and complex longitudinal data with appropriate quantitative methods (such as panel regressions, event history models, sibling models, growth curve models, or sequence analysis), and c) good writing skills in academic English. The capacity to conduct independent research and good collaboration skills are essential.
	Successful conduct of the editorial assistant role requires reliability, punctuality, good judgment, and collaboration skills.
