<b>Title of project</b>	Twentieth-Century International Economic Thinking, and the Complex History of Globalization (ECOINT)
<b>Job description</b>	The ECOINT ERC project will start in October 2020 and will run for 60 months. It will advance an innovative approach to the study of the struggles over economic ideas that have fashioned the paths to globalization. It will focus on 'international economic thinking' generated in and through institutional sites distinctive to the 20th century: intergovernmental organisations and associated international non-governmental organisations. Its main research questions are: <i>Where</i> do we find international globalization thinking? <i>Who</i> were international economic thinkers? <i>How</i> did they shape the course of globalization? <i>What</i> does it mean that many of them were women? What does this history tell us about the paths taken or missed by globalization?

	<p>The Senior Research Fellow will have three major tasks:</p> <p>1) work with the Project leader on <i>A global history of 20th century international economic thinking</i>; in particular they will focus on post-1990 developments, the political impact of non-traditional thinkers in IGOs and INGOs and the lessons to be drawn for the future of international order</p> <p>2) lead the digital humanities component, a dedicated online platform</p> <p>3) lead the Public Outreach program, dedicated to engaging public stakeholders, in particular in the EU, on the research and its implications for the future of international order . They will work with the EUI's Robert Schuman Centre to consider the kinds of globalized futures these ideas make imaginable and featuring women economists in our conversations.</p> <p>In the context of the ECOINT project, the Senior Research Fellow will carry out the following tasks:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Research, write and publish on their selected topic area.</li> <li>• Work as part of a team on a co-authored volume.</li> <li>• Engage public stakeholders and lead public debate on the project's implications for the future of international order;</li> <li>• Lead outreach program of workshops, public panels, podcasts.</li> <li>• Lead digital humanities dimension of the ERC.</li> <li>• Mentor research (postdoctoral) fellows.</li> </ul>
<b>Place of work</b>	Preferably Florence (Italy), but other arrangements can be discussed
<b>Qualifications</b>	<p>The candidate should be well-published, with experience in research, writing, and outreach, and able to mentor postdoctoral fellows. The candidate should have familiarity with the literature on international intergovernmental and non-governmental organisations, international relations and global governance, including knowledge of relevant literature in the history of globalisation and its intellectual foundations. He/she should have familiarity with the theoretical and empirical literature on the role of non-state actors in international relations.</p> <p>Requirements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• PhD degree in social sciences;</li> <li>• Relevant publications (journal articles, book chapters, books);</li> <li>• Familiarity with the fields of international organisations, global civil society and global governance, including the history of globalisation and its intellectual foundations;</li> <li>• Broad familiarity with the fields of international and economic history;</li> <li>• Experience in developing and curating digital research database;</li> <li>• Experience in working in an interdisciplinary research environment;</li> <li>• Excellent writing skills;</li> <li>• Proven ability to reach beyond academia and engage with public stakeholders;</li> </ul>
