Title of project:	MAPS – Migrants And People Smugglers: A Comparative Study of Smuggling Networks in the Eastern Mediterranean and the Central American corridors To what extent is human smuggling a criminal enterprise driven by solidarity and cooperation? This is the question that my project "MAPS – Migrants And People Smugglers" addresses through a comparative study – of the Eastern Mediterranean and the Central American smuggling corridors. Having almost concluded my research in the Eastern Mediterranean corridor, the project will concentrate almost exclusively on the Central American route in order to identify similarities and differences in the organizational structures of smuggling networks, the smuggler-migrant relationship, and the profile of the facilitators. MAPS seeks to make a contribution to studies on Human Smuggling and Irregular Migration, where there is a keen interest in – yet still insufficient knowledge about – the interaction between migrants and facilitators and where criminological perspectives still dominate the debate. MAPS adopts a critical perspective and departs from the idea that smugglers obey only to a profit making logic. Inviting instead for a more complex understanding of their roles, it argues that human smuggling is embedded within ethnic networks and local

	economies, which are grounded on deep notions of solidarity and reciprocity. By expanding current knowledge around smuggling and its related policies, the project also aims to provide an empirical platform for policy engagement.
Job description:	 Working under supervision of Dr Luigi Achilli, the selected candidate will have to: Transcribe recorded interviews (Arabic → English; Italian → English; Italian → English). Support the PI in monitoring and analysing migration flows and trends in the MENA region, with an emphasis on the Middle East (Syria, Lebanon, Jordan, other GCC countries, Iran, Iraq and Yemen). Assist the PI with follow-up interviews and secure access to new contacts (migrants, humanitarian actors, local authorities) in the region (especially Jordan)
Place of work:	Preferably Jordan, Lebanon will be acceptable
Qualifications:	 Essential: MA in social sciences (Middle East studies, International Relations, Social Anthropology, or related disciplines) Analytical skills and capacity to assess the quality and relevance of information.
