It has a strong Syria component (Wartime and Post-Conflict in Syria), including research activities, regular dialogue between researchers, policymakers and practitioners, and training a network of Syrian researchers.
	The Research Associate will contribute to research and policy advices on select issues relevant to the Wartime and Post-Conflict in Syria project. S/he will coordinate with WPCS partners. S/he will liaise with donors, policymakers and will be in charge to organise regular dialogue with external stakeholders.
