<b>Job description:</b>	<p>The Research Fellow will be responsible for coordinating the design and delivery of training on international migration offered by the MPC within the STG. The STG delivers teaching and high-level training in the methods, knowledge, skills and practice of governance beyond the State. The School brings the worlds of academia and policy-making together in an effort to navigate a context, both inside and outside Europe, where policy-making increasingly transcends national borders. In 2020, a policy-focused Masters programme for graduates has been launched, to be followed in 2021 by an executive-level Masters for professionals. The Migration Policy Centre will coordinate training on international migration within the STG.
