Essential Criteria:

- PhD in political science;
- Previous experience of providing research assistance to a principal investigator of a national or international research project;
- Team-working skills as evidenced by participation in international research teams;
- Authoring skills in the field of regulation as evidenced by published articles and/or book chapters;
- Blogging skills as evidenced by blog posts or short articles available for wide dissemination;
- Presentation skills to different audiences of university researchers as well public managers, as evidence by participation to appropriate conferences and events
- Cross-country knowledge of consultation procedures, regulatory impact assessment, and judicial review in the European Union member states;
- Advanced understanding of the socio-legal and political science literatures on regulatory policy instruments as evidenced by the PhD or publications;
- Availability to travel abroad for conferences (pending the restrictions imposed by governments in the pandemic) or in alternatively to work and present on-line.
