Job description

The research fellow will carry out research work in an independent manner and collaborate on the research work of the project.

The main task of the research officer is to study the policy-making processes during the euro area crises and around the Covid-19 pandemic; at the national level (in 16 EU member-states), the transnational and the supranational level. This includes the reconstruction of these processes, the mapping of conflicts, and the identification of the relevant coalitions for policy decisions based on a variety of empirical approaches.
