Glancing at the flats

Hello EUI Flats Community, and Happy 2021!

The winter holidays have ended and a brand new year is ahead of us! As many of you are returning to the Flats following Christmas break, and others are just checking in, we hope this month's newsletter will help you get settled in and excited about what's to come.

The EUI4U Housing Office envisions this Newsletter as a place where tenants can share useful information regarding life at the Flats; where the REFS can update tenants on changes or construction that is currently taking place (or that is schedule to take place in the upcoming months); and, why not, an outlet where we can share one or two photos or creative pieces per month taken by tenants who have an eye for photography. Because this project is brand new, we can mold it into whatever works best for *you*!



What's happening at the Flats?

Bike Racks Installation: as we mentioned in our December newsletter, covered bike racks will likely



be installed at PAB at the beginning of 2021. We hope that all bike-owners will

take advantage of this new addition, which will help remove all bikes from stairwells and corridors. PDM has already been equipped with a bike rack that we hope will help all bike-owning tenants.

Automatic gate at PDM: the automatic gate at PDM is underway and almost complete! If you own a car and wish to park it in the garage, please email us at eui4u.flats@eui.eu requesting a remote control. Because of the limited amount of parking spaces, please note that there is a limit of one car per

family/apartment. Do not forget to register your motorized vehicle with the EUI Parking Office.

Water dispenser at PAB: The new water dispenser has been installed in the basement at PAB. We hope that this water dispenser will contribute to the EUI's green mission and that we will see a reduction in the use of plastic bottles.

New waste bins: the recycling bins have been delivered to all PAB and PDM apartments. All flats are now equipped with 4 waste-bins, to be used to properly recycle all trash items. As a reminder, here are the **specific trash pick-up** days:

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PAB Tree Removal: all dead trees at PAB have been removed and 15 new trees have been replanted.

Stairwell cleaning at PAB: the cleaning and repainting of all four stairwells at PAB is underway. Please refrain from leaving your bikes in the stairwells, as they constitute a fire hazard and might get damaged during the repairs.

Storage room at PDM: we are currently discussing the possibility of installing closed storage racks at PDM. While the space is limited, using a small percentage of the parking spots might seem the best option. Of course, it is not our intention to diminish parking spots at PDM, so the installation of storage

closets will closely depend on the feasibility of this improvement.

More greenery at PAB: we are looking into planting bushes and plants in the central areas of PAB Flats. Once the nicer weather comes knocking, our Maintenance Unit will update us on this possibly.

Electronic check-in and check-out procedures: we are working on digitalizing the check-in and check-out process. A new software is being developed, which will allow us to eliminate paper forms, save trees, and make the entire task more efficient.

That's Good to Know!

While some tenants have been living at the flats for some time, and might know all the ropes, we would like to offer some useful information for all newcomers:

- ✚ Please remember to register your motorized vehicle upon arrival. We ask that you also register any guests' vehicles, as well. You can do so via this link:

- ✚ If PAB residents require a remote control to open the car gate, please send us an email at eui4u.flats@eui.eu. You will be able to pick the remote up directly at the EUI4U Housing Office (BF065) and you will be asked to return it upon check-out. Please note that remote controls have a cost of 25 euros, which you will be asked to pay at check-out if the remote control is lost or broken.
- ✚ All tenants can report maintenance issues in their apartment by opening a ticket via the EUI4U Helpdesk:
<https://helpdesk.eui.eu/Account/Login?ReturnUrl=%2fCustomerPortal>. Please note that maintenance staff can enter your apartment within five working days,

between the hours of 9:00am and 4:00pm. Your presence is not required at the time of their visit. Should their intervention require a second visit, the apartment tenants will be duly informed.

- ✚ The laundry rooms at PAB and PDM are now equipped with hand sanitizer, as well as disinfectant and paper towels that you can use to wipe down washing machines and dryers before each use. Please refrain from using the laundry room between 11:00pm and 7:00am to avoid any disturbance.

COVID-19 Updates



While the situation in Italy (and around the world) is ever changing, we would like to remind all tenants that as of today, Tuscany finds itself in the “yellow” group of regions.

This means that:

- A curfew is in place between the hours of 10:00pm and 5:00am, unless there are serious work-related or health-related reasons that force you to leave your apartment. Should that be the case, you must carry an “[autocertificazione](#)”, or “auto-declaration” on you at all times.
- Restaurants, bars, cafes, ice cream parlours are open until 6:00pm. Take away is available

until 10:00pm, and delivery is available until midnight.

- Museums are open from Monday to Friday (except holidays).
- Gyms and pools are closed. You can exercise individually outside or practice non-contact sports.
- Middle-school students will attend in-person lessons. High-school students will study from home 50% of the time, and will attend classes in person for 50% of the time.
- University courses and laboratories might be held in a hybrid or remote format.
- Stores remain open. All stores inside shopping centers will remain closed on weekends and holidays, with the exception of grocery stores and markets, pharmacies, tobacconists, and newspaper stands.
- Until February 16th, no one can leave Tuscany unless it is for work or health-related reasons (you must carry an “autocertificazione” or “auto-declaration” with you at all times). From February 16th to March 5th, you will be able to move from one yellow region to another yellow region
- You can visit friends and family once per day within Tuscany. The visit must be limited to two people (excluding children under the age of 14 and people with disabilities).

Should Tuscany become an “orange” region in the near future, here is what you should keep in mind:

- A curfew is in place between the hours of 10:00pm and 5:00am, unless there are serious work-related or health-related reasons that force you to leave your apartment. Should that be the case, you must carry an “[autocertificazione](#)”, or “auto-declaration” on you at all times.
- Restaurants, bars, cafes, ice cream parlours are closed to the public. Take away is

available until 10:00pm, and delivery is available until midnight.

- Museums and cultural centers will remain closed.
- Gyms and pools are closed. You can exercise individually outside or practice non-contact sports within your Comune of residency (in your case, Florence or Fiesole).
- All high-school students will study from home 100% of the time. University courses and laboratories might take place in a hybrid or remote format.
- Stores remain open. All stores inside shopping centers will remain closed on weekends and holidays, with the exception of grocery stores and markets, pharmacies, tobacconists, and newspaper stands.
- Travel to and from other regions, as well as from one Comune to another, is not allowed, unless there are serious work-related or health-related reasons. Should that be the case, you must carry an “[autocertificazione](#)”, or “auto-declaration” on you at all times.
- You can visit friends and family once per day within your Comune of residence (in your case, Florence or Fiesole). The visit must be limited to two people (excluding children under the age of 14 and people with disabilities).

Finally, should Tuscany become a “red” zone, here is what you need to know:

- A curfew is in place between the hours of 10:00pm and 5:00am, unless there are serious work-related or health-related reasons that force you to leave your apartment. Should that be the case, you must carry an “[autocertificazione](#)”, or “auto-declaration” on you at all times.
- Restaurants, bars, cafes, ice cream parlours are closed to the public. Take away is

available until 10:00pm, and delivery is available until midnight.

- Museums and cultural centers will remain closed.
- Gyms, pools, and sports centers are closed. You can exercise individually outside.
- All stores, with the exception of primary necessity stores (grocery stores, pharmacies, opticians), tobacconists, newspaper stands, and personal care stores, will remain closed until further notice.
- All high-school and university students will study from home 100% of the time. Second and third-year middle school students will also study from home 100% of the time.
- Travel to and from other regions, as well as from one Comune to another, is not allowed, unless there are serious work-related or health-related reasons. Should that be the case, you must carry an “[autocertificazione](#)”, or “auto-declaration” on you at all times.
- You can visit one household per day within your Comune of residence (in your case, Florence or Fiesole). The visit must be limited to two people (excluding children under the age of 14 and people with disabilities).

As a reminder, tenants who are currently sharing a flat with a non-family member, and who are entering Italy from a non-EU or Schengen-Area country, must self-isolate for 15 days outside of their PAB or PDM apartment. The EUI has a convention with the Student Hotel, although there are many other options, as well.

You will be happy to know that the EUI has established agreements with four medical centers and medical practitioners in Florence, where you can get several types of COVID-19 tests at a discounted price:

Life Brain Medical Center

- Coronavirus Sars-Cov-2 test (includes confirmation test in case of positivity IgM/IgA-IgG): €32
- COVID Molecular RNA swab: €65
- COVRAG antigenic swab test: €32

Fanfani Medical Center

- Rapid qualitative test NCOV19 (IGG and IGM): €28
- Antibodies Anti-Ncov19 test (IGG and IGM): €48

Helab Medical Center

- Qualitative blood test: €35
- Quantitative blood test: €50
- Rapid antigenic nasopharyngeal test: €60
- Molecular nasopharyngeal test in PCR: €80

Dr. Kurpanik

- Roche nasopharyngeal swab: €50 in doctor's office, €65 at home visit
- Simens nasal swab: €50 in doctor's office, €65 at home visit
- Abbott antibodies test: €50 in doctor's office, €65 at home visit

Winter Months

Although the colder winter months are upon us, you should remember that it is still important to air out your apartments. Air exchange is recommended to

decrease the spread of Covid19, as well as one of the best ways to prevent dampness and mould. We strongly recommend that you do not air wet clothes to dry inside of the apartment—please use the dryers as much as possible or, for PDM tenants with terraces, drying racks. If you do choose to dry your clothes inside, please open your windows and let some fresh air in. You should also open your windows after showering and after cooking, as to avoid the stagnation of any excess vapour.



As a reminder, heating in Italy is centralized and it depends on the Comune of residence (in your case, Florence and Fiesole). Tenants cannot set their own temperature in each apartment; rather, the EUI has set specific windows of time during which the heating will turn on automatically. These times are between 7:00am and 12:00pm, and again between 2:00pm and 10:00pm. However, please rest assured that should the temperature ever drop below 17°C (which is highly unlikely), the heating will turn on automatically.

Meet the EUI4U Team

From questions on how to enrol your kids in school, to requesting suggestions on medical practitioners; from practical questions on how to purchase a bus ticket to suggestions on a good restaurant, the Life in Florence team is here to help. You might also want to check out the many discounts and agreements that all EUI members have with local businesses and associations. The Life in Florence team is also in charge of organizing the extracurricular activities for the STG Master Students, as well as creating a Volunteer network in Florence in which all EUI members can get involved.
- **Life on Campus:** Stefania Bocchi and Julia Valerio will be able to answer all your queries regarding life on campus—including extra-curricular activities and events.
- **Technical troubleshooting:** the fifth member of the EUI4U team is Dario Fantini,

our in-house ICT support who helps newcomers set up their own laptops, phones, and looks after the installation of licenses for specific software (e.g. STATA).

- **Florence Housing Service:** Mariagrazia Calise is responsible for the private housing market at the EUI. She works for Florence Housing Service and shares an office with Jennifer and Federica in Badia Fiesolana 065.
