Decision N° 9/08 of the High Council
of 12 December 2008

**amending Decision N° 12/89 of 7 December 1989
on the adoption of the rules of procedure of the Appeals Board**

THE HIGH COUNCIL,

Having regard to the Convention setting up a European University Institute, and in particular Article 6(5)(c) thereof,

Having regard to the Common Provisions for Teaching and Administrative Staff (hereinafter referred to as "the Common Provisions"), and in particular Articles 1 and 2 (numbered Articles 74 and 75 prior to 1 January 2005) thereof,

Having regard to Decision n° 12/89 of 7 December 1989 adopting the rules of procedure of the Appeals Board,

Having regard to Decision n° 8/06 of 8 December 2006 establishing an Organ of First Instance within the Appeals Board,

Whereas EU norms foresee a three-month deadline for the introduction of an appeal of the First Instance and a deadline of two months for presenting an appeal against the decisions of the EU Civil Service Tribunal,

Whereas, in the light of these EU norms, it is appropriate to increase the deadline with regard to the introduction of an appeal of the First Instance and an appeal to the Appeals Board,

Having the EUI President consulted the Appeals Board and First Instance full members on this proposal,

HAS DECIDED AS FOLLOWS:

Article 1

Article 14, paragraph 4 of High Council Decision N. 12/89 shall be replaced by the following text:

"Appeals of the First Instance must be submitted in writing within three months of the date of the notification of the Principal's decision on the complaint or of expiry of the period prescribed in Article 74 (2)¹ of the Common Provisions.

Appeals to the Appeals Board must be submitted in writing within two months of the date of the notification of the First Instance's decision."


Article 2
